Evidence: a report or presentation for ICT solutions which assesses the needs defines ICT solutions and evaluates the solutions in response to three case studies. Each of the individuals in these case studies will have different needs and candidates need to include one case study that relates to an individual who has sensory needs. The candidate's evidence needs to: show an understanding of legislation and the rights of each of the individuals in connection with the candidate's ICT solutions; show a clear understanding of the disabilities or limiting factors and resultant needs, identify and show suitable items of equipment and software as appropriate; evaluate the viability and effectiveness of the candidate's proposed solutions, indicating how the solutions will enhance the quality of life for each individual; present reports or presentations in a way that is suitable for the needs of the individuals outlined in each case study, or for a carer if the case study is that of a young child or a person with very limited understanding; for at least one case study, provide a specification for a complete system, to include configuration and customisation of software and equipment as appropriate and demonstrate that candidates can customise the available operating system and applications evaluating their actions and role in solving this problem.
