


Introduction: the Iron Age and Roman defences of Le Yaudet, Brittany

The site of Le Yaudet in Brittany, France, occupies a commanding position. Occupation has continued from the Bronze Age, through the Iron Age and Roman Periods, to the present day. It has been a site of archaeological interest for well over a century. Between 1991 and 1993 a number of excavations were carried out on the main defensive works, on the enclosure to the south of the site, and on the Iron Age and Roman defences in the north-east corner.


Map 1 France, showing the approximate location of Map 2

or the vertical face of the rampart (shown as **B** in **Figure 2**).

Which of these statements is true? Give reasons for your answer. *(3 marks)*

4 Study **Figure 4** and **Figure 5**.

What evidence might archaeologists have found to enable them to interpret Feature F114 as an oven? *(4 marks)*

5 Study **Figure 4** and **Figure 5** and use your own knowledge.

Discuss how pre-excavation techniques may have highlighted the various features shown in Figure 5. *(12 marks)*

6 Study **Figure 4** and **Figure 5** and use your own knowledge.

Describe and explain how Feature F114 might have been excavated and recorded. *(13 marks)*



Figure 1 Location of some of the excavation areas


Figure 3 Photograph of part of excavation area 4 (as shown in Figure 2)
