Answer two questions.

1 (a) Examine why the writers of the synoptic gospels edited the material they used.

(30 marks)

- (b) Assess the claim that the synoptic gospels cannot be trusted to give an accurate account of the life of Jesus. (15 marks)
- 2 (a) Examine the theology and teaching found in the Parable of the Tenants in the Vineyard. (30 marks)
 - (b) Assess the view that the main purpose of the parables was to give guidance for behaviour. (15 marks)
- 3 (a) Explain what Mark and Luke teach about the person of Jesus in their accounts of his crucifixion and death. (30 marks)
 - (b) 'Luke's claims about the person of Jesus are unconvincing.'

Assess this view with reference to Luke's account of Jesus' crucifixion and death. *(15 marks)*

- 4 (a) Examine the main differences between the accounts of the resurrection of Jesus recorded in Matthew and Luke. *(30 marks)*
 - (b) 'The resurrection narratives are of little importance for Christian faith.'

Assess this claim.
