Your answers should refer to the source as appropriate, but you should also include other relevant information.

- (a) Briefly outline from the source **two** methods used by the campaigners to apply pressure on the Government. (4 marks)
- (b) Briefly examine the role of the media in relation to the success of campaigns such as Jamie Oliver's school dinners campaign. (10 marks)
- (c) Critically assess the importance of factors **other than** use of the media to the success of a pressure group campaign. (16 marks)

- 2 (a) Briefly examine three factors which influence voting behaviour. (10 marks)
 - (b) 'Individual Members of Parliament have little influence over government policy and decision making.' Assess this claim. (20 marks)

OR

- **3** (a) Briefly examine how Conservative Party ideology has changed since the early 1970s. (10 marks)
 - (b) 'The current electoral system (first past the post) prevents the UK Parliament from being fully representative of society.' Assess this claim. (20 marks)
