Post-modernists such as Lyotard (1984) make two major claims. Firstly, they claim that we no longer live in a 'modern' society and argue instead that we have moved into a new era, that of 'post-modernity'. Secondly, they claim that all knowledge is relative to those who hold it and that absolute truth is unattainable. If so, this means that there is no way in which sociologists (or any other 'experts') can obtain objective knowledge about society. Sociological perspectives are simply meta-narratives and there is no objective way of choosing between them.

- (a) Briefly explain what is meant by 'meta-narratives' (Item B, line 6). (2 marks)
- (b) Identify and briefly explain **two** disadvantages of using quantitative methods (**Item A**).

- (d) Briefly examine the contribution of post-modernism to our understanding of society today. (10 marks)
