

- (a) What does the data set out above illustrate? [3]
- (b) Explain the role of Administrative tribunals. [7]
- (c) Why is it necessary to reform the tribunal system? [15]

2. Read the following extract carefully and answer the questions based on it.

“Research carried out by the Legal Services Commission Research Unit in 2002 found that over 1.5 million people do not take any action to resolve their legal problems because of lack of knowledge about how to do so. The study also found that people from disadvantaged groups such as those with a long-term illness or disability were more likely to experience legal problems. Interestingly, the research also identified the important role played by advisers without legal qualifications. 40% of respondents did not seek help with legal problems from traditional sources of legal help such as solicitors or advice centres, but turned to social workers, health professionals, social security offices and religious organisations. This finding challenges our assumptions about the most effective way to try and improve access to legal advice and assistance.”
