How do they travel?

Albatrosses are very large birds that can fly very long distances. In fact one albatross has been recorded as flying 6000 km in 12 days. **B**

Albatrosses spend most of their lives flying, and they have amazing wings that can 'lock' into place so they can glide through the air without having to flap their wings all the time. **C**

Did you know?

Albatrosses can live for a very long time, and one was recorded as living for 85 years. **D**

The Wandering Albatross has a wingspan of up to 3.5 metres. **B**

Breeding habits

The female albatross lays a single egg every two years. Eggs usually hatch after about two months. **B**

Albatross nests are made mainly of mud and grass. **C**

What do they eat?

Albatrosses eat mainly squid and fish, but they will follow ships to pick up food scraps. **A**



Where can you find them?

There are more than 12 different types of albatross and the largest kind is the Wandering Albatross. **B**

Albatrosses are mainly found around Antarctica, but some live near Alaska, China and Japan. **A**

Fruity Favourite

Preparation:

10 minutes Serves 1

Ingredients

1 cup mixed fruit 1/2 cup ice cubes

Method:

Preparation:

Berry Surprise

Preparation:

5 minutes Serves 1–2

Ingredients

3/4 cup milk2 tablespoonsice-cream3/4 cup frozen berries

Method:

Mix all ingredients in a blender for 1 minute.

Pour into a glass and serve straight away.

Hint: When berries are in season and cheapest to buy, why not buy extra and freeze them in your fridge? Then you will have frozen berries all through the year.



Hot-Air Balloons

Hot-air balloons are filled with air.

The hotter the air inside the balloon is, the higher the balloon rises. Balloonists control the height of their balloons by changing the temperature of the air inside the balloon.

They make the air hotter by turning gas burners up, and cooler by turning the burners down low. However, balloonists do not have much control over the direction in which they fly. This is mainly influenced by the wind.

The first hot-air balloon was made from paper and cloth held together with buttons. Its first passengers were farm animals. Two months later the first human passengers travelled in the balloon.
