(c) Discuss how the neutral vowel and stress contribute to fluid speech rhythm, using your phonetic transcription of the text in part (a) of this question to support your answer.

(vii) Indicate where the climax occurs and support your decision.

(b) Identify and explain strategies for the meaningful and imaginative interpretation of the poem that reflect the poet's intention.
