QUESTION 1

(a) Transcribe phonetically (using narrow form IPA symbols) the following text to represent Cultivated Australian speech, indicating primary and secondary stress, vowel length, syllabic consonants, linking 'r' and dark 'lÚ' as they occur.

(a) Your agent has indicated that you have been asked to audition for a role you feel confident you can play.

How will you prepare for the audition?

(b) From a play written in the nineteenth century, select a character you would like to play.

Indicate the name of the play, the character. Discuss essential elements of style, so that movement, gesture and manners have authenticity.

In your discussion refer to a particular scene from the play.

 - (i) A member of the cast does not make eye contact with you on stage or
