- 1 Trialgro is an agricultural research company. It is in the process of developing new crops that will provide increased yields and greater disease resistance for UK farms at a time when food self-sufficiency is hitting the headlines. It is involved with the development of both hybridised and genetically modified (GM) crops.

Over the last 30 years some crops in the UK have been infected with new pests and diseases. It is vitally important to the agricultural industry that these are kept under control. One method of helping to control the spread of pests and diseases is by the use of Quarantine Identification Cards (QICs).



2 Trialgro also has to deal with problems facing a commercial farm. One of its ongoing battles is against potato blight. The key information that Trialgro has to consider is:

- potatoes form a part of Trialgro's hybridisation process throughout the year
- last year a control field of potatoes showed signs of potato blight in one small area
- potato blight affects the length of time for which potatoes can be stored.

As soon as the disease is identified, the standard procedure is followed. The affected crops are lifted and an area the same size around the affected area is also cleared.

- the roof of the main storage barn needed repair
- potato-pickers were carried on an open trailer to the field area in which they were working
- in August the swine flu outbreak meant that Trialgro was short staffed and staff were working long hours every day without a break for three weeks
- 25kg bags of potatoes from the trial plots were manually loaded onto the open trailer for transport to storage barn.
