

Basic Referees Training Course Information

The course is structured as five modules and you need to complete them all to qualify.

Module 1– Introduction: You will begin by learning about the role of the referee and the laws of the game. Module 1 will also help you to consider the skills you will need to control a game of football.

Module 2 – Practical Elements: Referees need to take care with their positioning and movement at both set pieces and in open play. You will be taught warming up and cooling down activities.

Module 3 – Examination

Module 4 – Refereeing: You will also learn about signals used during matches and communication techniques.

Module 5 – Qualification and the Next Steps: This is designed to prepare you for life as a fully qualified referee and advise you of the next steps that you can take to develop your skills and knowledge as a referee. 


