Beach litter



Litter on beaches looks bad, is a hazard to health and costs millions of pounds to clean up. Litter in the sea can harm or kill wildlife.

Litter found on beaches includes paper, tin cans, glass and plastic. Plastic is the biggest problem as it just breaks down into small pieces and never goes away. In some parts of the sea, there is more plastic than there are fish.

Seabirds often think plastic litter is food and they can become trapped in plastic containers.

Marine creatures can be cut by glass or tin cans and have trouble swimming.

What you can do to help:

- never leave litter on a beach – use the bins provided
- encourage people not to drop litter on the beach
- join an organised Beach Clean.
