Item C

Meals for All

Meals for All has recently been set up as a local social enterprise. It prepares and cooks quality hot meals five days a week for elderly people. The meals are collected from Meals for All by volunteers, who deliver them within the local area. The premises are provided free of charge by the local council.

To satisfy its customers' needs, *Meals for All* offers a wide choice of meals, which changes each day. Customers telephone each morning to find out the menu for the day and to make their choice. This means that sometimes one choice runs out but others go to waste and meals are often delivered late.

The cost of ingredients is likely to increase over the next few months. The cook is considering many options to reduce the costs of the meals including buying cheaper ingredients. Another way would be to offer less choice and to ask customers to order a day in advance. This would mean that the exact amount of ingredients could be bought and there would be less wastage. However, some of the customers have indicated that they would not like this and would prefer to give their first and second choice of meal.
