Answer TWO questions from Section A and ONE from Section B.


SECTION A

OR

- 2 To what extent do you think the design of the Greek theatre suited its purpose?**

In your answer, you might like to discuss:

- its size, shape and layout and the stage machinery used;**
- how far this suited the needs of the people who used the theatre;**
- anything else that you think is significant. [30]**


SECTION A

- 3 The picture below shows the chariot-racing track in Rome. Study the picture and answer ALL the questions that follow.**



The picture shows the chariot-racing track in Rome. It shows a long, thin space with tiered sides and one semicircular end. The other end is flatter and has a series of openings. There is a thin line of monuments down the middle of the space, dividing it equally. This line does not extend as far as the ends of the track. The whole is overlooked by a very large building with many windows facing down.

(a) Name the chariot-racing track in Rome and describe how a chariot race started.

(b) Explain how a chariot race might be dangerous for a charioteer.

(c) Why do you think Romans enjoyed going to the chariot-races?

OR

- 2 ‘Death, death and yet more death.’ How useful is this statement in helping us to understand why a day at the Colosseum was so popular?**

In your answer, you might like to discuss:

- the visual spectacle of the show;**
- the different reasons for the audience enjoying the day;**
- anything else that you think is significant. [30]**
