Answers cover 1-3 points on physical health, but are vague and not reasoned. Generally superficial, lacking structure and may be repetitive. 7			<p>Likely points will include Eric's stress causing physical effects – disturbed sleep, raised blood pressure/fatigue make him irritable – moody as emotional effects. May lose work skills become bored as intellectual effects. Eric's loss of job – long term unemployment adding to the stress. Causing loss of self confidence, lowered self esteem (emotional) good friends support him, help feel good – but only occasionally, may be affected by poor personal hygiene as social effects. Lack of regular exercise – may cause weight gain, increase risks of weight related illness – heart disease, can survive on money – may feel good - little spare cash – to do what friends do.</p> <p>Mark Ranges 0 marks. No response worthy of credit</p> <p>1-4 marks. Answers cover 1-4 points mainly statements which are not reasoned, and are vague and/or repetitive. Effects not identified as physical, intellectual, emotional or social. Answers superficial, lack structure and there will be errors in spelling, punctuation and grammar.</p> <p>5-8 marks. Answers cover 5 or more points with some reasoning as to how they cause their effects. Some effects identified as physical, intellectual, emotional and/or social. Answers are organised but lack precision. There may be some use of appropriate terminology with some errors in spelling, punctuation and grammar.</p> <p>9-12 marks. Answers cover at least 6 points in good detail identifying physical, intellectual, emotional and social aspects as appropriate. Answers are well structured, logical and demonstrate good spelling, punctuation and grammar. There is good use of appropriate terminology.</p>	12
