**Source A**: From a history of the twentieth century, published in 2001.

In 1917 the Tsar was in command of Russia's armed forces, even though he had no military experience. He believed it was his duty and that the army would fight better if he were leading it. This had two important consequences. First, Nicholas was blamed for the continued poor performance of the Russian army. Second, he was out of Petrograd and unable to respond quickly to the events of early 1917.
