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Introduction

Religious Studies B. Paper 1: Area of Study 1 – Religion and Ethics, Islam.

Section 1: Muslim Beliefs

This was the first examination for the new 9-1 specification in Religious Studies for Option 1: Religion and Ethics. It comprises fifty percent of the whole award for Religious Studies. The paper consists of four questions, one from each section of the specification. Candidates have no choice in the questions, and should answer all questions.

Question 1 (a)

The question asked candidates to 'Outline three Muslim beliefs about Paradise...' An outline should consist of three short sentences which provide, for example, a way, an attitude, or a belief depending on the command word of the question.

Most candidates were able to suggest three accurate beliefs about paradise for Muslims and were awarded three marks.

This example is included as representative of the work of a more able candidate. The beliefs are clearly articulated and are specific to Islam.

The candidate was awarded 3 marks. The candidate outlined three correct beliefs.

(i) The people of paradise are said in the Qur'an to wear garments of green silk (1). (This is from Surah 18:31)

(ii) They will be sitting on thrones raised high (1). (This is from Surah 12:21)

(iii) The good, pious and righteous who believed in Allah and the last day will have the reward of paradise (1).




Focus on the command word in the question. In this case 'beliefs'.

It is not necessary to quote from a source of authority to achieve full marks in an 'Outline' question.

Muslims believe that if you oney Allah then you inlenter paradise.

Save time by not elaborating in a) questions.

This is included as an example of a candidate who had limited knowledge of Muslim beliefs but the beliefs offered were accurate.

The candidate was awarded 2 marks. The candidate outlined two correct beliefs.

(i) Only Muslims who have been good and please Allah will go to paradise (1).

(ii) Paradise will be full of flowers and beautiful things (1).



Candidates gain no further credit for developing their response in an 'Outline' question. One idea can only gain 1 mark.

Inaccurate information was not credited.

The candidate outlined one correct belief.

(i) You go to paradise if you lived as a good Muslim (1).

The first point offered by the candidate was not credited since Muhammad is not responsible for judging Muslims.



Focus on brief, accurate statements of belief.

Question 1 (b)

In 1(b) questions candidates are asked to explain two reasons or ways. In order to achieve full marks the candidate must give two developed reasons. Only two reasons can be credited. A development will usually take the form of a relevant quote from a source of authority, an example or further information which adds to the value of the response whilst remaining directly relevant.

This was included as an example of a candidate who achieved full marks by clearly considering all holy books rather than just the Qur'an.

The candidate was awarded 4 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons.

(i). They teach Muslims about their religion Islam (1), developed by, this helps us to understand how to worship Allah (1).

(ii). They teach Muslims about other scriptures (1), developed by, that were sent to other prophets (1).



Read the question carefully, a question about all the holy books cannot be answered solely by reference to the Qur'an. Less able candidates were often able to give two basic reasons, though these were not developed.

The candidate was awarded 2 marks. The candidate gave 2 simple reasons.

(i) It is God's word (1).

It is acceptable to refer to Allah as God. The attempted development was not credited since Muslims believe all the holy books, with the exception of the Qur'an, have been changed and therefore Allah's word has been corrupted.

(ii) It tells them how they should live the perfect life as a Muslim (1).



The development must refer to all the holy books, not just the Qur'an.

The work of this candidate was included as an example of a student who appeared to be answering a question about the importance of the Qur'an rather than all the holy books.

The candidate was awarded 0 marks. The candidate has not answered the question. These facts may be true of the Qur'an but they do not apply to all the holy books. The specification refers to the kutub, so in this question, references to the Hadith cannot be accepted.



Link the question to the specification to be clear on the topic under consideration.

Question 1 (c)

The question asked candidates to explain how two characteristics of Allah are shown in the Qur'an. There are five marks available in (c) questions. Of these, four marks are awarded in exactly the same way as (b) questions, for two developed reasons. The final mark is awarded for the accurate use of a source of authority as a quote, or recognisable paraphrase of the source.

This was included as an example of a candidate who achieved full marks for a (c) question including the correct use of a source of authority.

The candidate was awarded 5 marks. The candidate gave two developed ways; with reference to an appropriate source of authority.

(i) Allah is described as one and has no partners (1), developed by, he should be worshipped alone and praised alone (1). It is mentioned in the Qur'an 'Worship God and shun false gods'. (1) (This is found in Surah 16:36 and was the source of authority.)

(ii). The Qur'an explains Allah's immanence (1) (he acts in the world is a definition and therefore not credited) developed by, and 'is closer to human beings than their jugular vein' (1). (Surah 50:16. This is a source of wisdom but functions as a development in this case.)

The source of wisdom can therefore be used as a reason, a development or as the source of authority. It cannot be used as two of these things in the same response. There must be five separate pieces of information.



Candidates should link their source of authority to a developed reason.

This is included as many candidates mentioned the source of authority as the Qur'an or the Hadith but failed to provide a recognisable quote or paraphrase.

The characteristics of Allah are shown in the Quran because Allah is omnipotent. This shows that he was powerful enough to create the Earth and us numeros. Allah is also Merciful. This shows that he forgues Muslims for cloing wrong and sinful things.

Secondly, the characteristics of Alich is shown in the Quran and his described to be Omniscient. This shows that Alian is all knowing eurol knows what all Muslims do.



The candidate was awarded 4 marks. The candidate gave two developed ways; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

Allah is omnipotent (1), developed by, he was powerful enough to create the earth (1).

Allah is merciful (1), developed by, he forgives Muslims for doing wrong and sinful things (1).

A vague mention of the Qur'an is not enough to constitute a reference to a source of authority so this was not credited.



It must be possible for the examiner to link the reference from the source of authority to a specific quote from the Qur'an and the Hadith. This is an example of a response offered by a less able candidate.

The candidate was awarded 1 mark. The candidate gave one simple way; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

The Qur'an says that Allah is omnibenevolent, omnipotent and omniscient (1).

The attempted development is merely a list of definitions, this was not credited as it did not add to the explanation.



Had the student said 'The Qur'an shows that Allah is omnibenevolent. It also describes him as omnipotent' they would have received two marks for two basic reasons.

Question 1 (d)

The (d) questions were asked in the following format.

(d) "Angels are at work in the world today."

Candidates were required to:

Evaluate this statement considering arguments for and against.

In your response you should:

- refer to Muslim teachings
- reach a justified conclusion.

In questions one and three the Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar marks were also added up to a maximum of three. The vast majority of candidates on this paper were awarded three marks for SPaG.

This was included as a mid range Level 1 response. Many of the marks awarded in this question are awarded for the AO2 skills of judgement and appraisal. Whilst candidates often demonstrated good knowledge and understanding of Islam, there was little evidence of either judgement of the value of the reasons or appraisal of the relative strength of the arguments offered. Some may agree with the statement because even though they are not physically seen, their actions are still relevant today. For example, it was Angel Jioni who gave the verealed the Ourian to prophet Muhammad (PBUH), and Also, the Ourian is an important part of Islam today. Another reason is because they are messengers of Allah.

Others may disagree with the statement because they are not here in the present world. Also, there are no longer any more messages to be passed on promallan to humanity. For example, Prophet Muhammad is the last Prophet and the Qur'an includes all the relevance and teachings a muslim needs to know today.

In conclusion, some will also agree because angels have had isual contact with Allah himself. In addition, angels are what link Allah to humanity and allow them to communicate. Another reason is because it is one of the six beliefs of Islam. Therefore, you must believe

in the relevance of angels to show commitment to Islam.

The candidate gained level 1 because:

Information/issues were identified

Superficial connections were made among a limited range of elements in the question, underpinned by isolated elements of understanding of religion and belief.

The response was awarded the middle mark in the level because:

There was little evidence of appraisal or judgements leading to a conclusion that was not justified.

The candidate spells and punctuates with consistent accuracy. Candidate uses rules of grammar with effective control of meaning overall. Candidate uses a wide range of specialist terms appropriately.

Don't forget to add the SPaG marks in sections 1 and 3. They are not applied to d questions in sections 2 and 4. Total mark awarded = 5.

The response was awarded the highest mark in the level because:

The candidate achieved all the mark scheme requirements for level 1.

The candidate spells and punctuates with consistent accuracy. Candidate uses rules of grammar with effective control of meaning overall. Candidate uses a wide range of specialist terms appropriately.

The candidate was awarded **9** marks. Level 2, highest mark = **6** SPaG = 3 The candidate gained level 2 because the response showed:

Superficial connections were made among many, but not all, of the elements in the question.

This was underpinned by a limited understanding of religion and belief. Judgements of a limited range of elements in the question were made. Judgements were not supported by an attempt appraise evidence, leading to a conclusion that was not fully justified.

The response was awarded the highest mark in the level because:

The candidate achieved the mark scheme requirements for level 2.

SPaG: This was awarded 3 marks because:

The candidate spells and punctuates with consistent accuracy. Candidate uses rules of grammar with effective control of meaning overall. Candidate uses a wide range of specialist terms appropriately.

Unfortunately many candidates focused on differences between man and women rather than equality.

This is included as an example of a candidate who focused on areas of gender equality in the family.

The candidate was awarded 3 marks. The candidate outlined three correct beliefs.

Men and women need to show kindness and mercy to each other (1). They are both responsible to bring up children in an Islamic environment (1). They both have a duty to make sure their children grow up as righteous people (1).



Make sure you answer the question you have been asked.

No additional credit can be awarded for development of the belief in an 'Outline' question.

Candidates were expected to provide specifically Islamic reasons in response.

The work of this candidate is included as an example of a candidate who gave two developed reasons.

In this case the candidate gave one developed and one simple reason.

Question 2 (c)

The question asked:

Explain **two** reasons why some Muslims allow divorce.

In your answer you must refer to a source of wisdom and authority.

This is included as an example of a simple reason.

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The candidate was awarded 1 mark. The candidate gave one simple reason; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

1. In the Qur'an Allah said it is all right to divorce (1).

Details of the divorce procedure do not explain why some Muslims allow divorce. Similarly a brief assertion 'In the Qu'ran' followed by a generic statement does not constitute a source of authority.



The development must link directly to both the reason and the question. Generic information rarely benefits the candidate. In order to be awarded the source of authority additional mark the source must be linked to a developed reason. In this case it was linked to a simple reason.

The source of authority was correctly identified as the Hadith, many candidates lost marks by attributing this quote to the Qur'an. The quote can only be credited if the source is correctly identified.

The candidate was awarded **3** marks. The candidate gave one simple reason with an appropriate source of authority, and a second simple reason.

'Allah has made lawful divorce the most hated act' ((Hadith) (1), developed by, but it should only take place when all the consequences have been taken into consideration (1).

Divorce may be allowed if disagreement is also occurring (1).

A further list of possible reasons when divorce may be allowed, none of which were developed, does not constitute the development of this reason and only two reasons can be credited.



Know where the source comes from.

This is included as an example of a response which gained full marks including the additional source of authority mark. This is clearly linked to the developed reason which follows it.

Allah has stated in the quian "Is they chood the Chose divorce ... Indeed pllan is all hearing and knowing." Therefore hasn't been forbidde. The candidate was awarded 5 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons; with reference to an appropriate source of authority.

Allah has stated in the Qur'an 'If they choose divorce... then Allah is all hearing and all knowing' (1) (Surah 2:227, Source of authority). Marriage is intended to be for life (1), developed by, but under certain circumstances Allah has allowed divorce (1).

If children are harmed by violence or anger (1), developed by, Allah loves his creation and would not harm Muslims (1).



It is often a good idea to start with the source of authority though other methods are also deemed creditworthy.

Question 2 (d)

The question asked:

"People should only have sex with the person they are married to."

Evaluate this statement considering arguments for and against.

In your response you should:

- refer to Muslim teachings
- refer to non-religious points of view
- reach a justified conclusion.

In questions 2 and 4 SPaG is not awarded. In this case in addition at Muslim teachings candidates were asked to consider non-religious points of view.

The work of this candidate was included as an example of a low level response which merely lists a number of isolated facts.

The candidate was awarded **1** mark. Level 1, lowest mark = **1** mark. The candidate gained level 1 because:

Isolated pieces of information were identified.

The response was awarded the lowest mark in the level because:

There was no attempt to link the responses to generate a coherent argument. The candidate made no attempt to make judgements on the value of the arguments or indeed to reach a conclusion.

Total mark awarded = **1**.



Do not list facts, make the facts work together to answer the question.

This response is clearly stronger than the preceding one as the candidate presents two simple arguments, one in favour of the statement, one against. The information contained in the response is accurate though does not demonstrate extensive knowledge of Islam. It contains a valid, but unsupported, non-religious perspective and has therefore fulfilled the demands of the question.

Judgements are supported by generic arguments to produce a conclusion that is not fully justified.

The response was awarded the highest mark in the level because:

The candidate fulfilled the requirements for Level 1.



Try to provide evidence to support assertions.

This is included as an example of a candidate reaching the top of level 2. In the absence of judgement of the value of the arguments or any appraisal, other than a brief justification as a personal opinion, it did not reach level 3.

The candidate was awarded **6** marks. Level 2, highest mark = 6 The candidate gained level 2 because:

Superficial connections are made among many, but not all, of the elements in the question.

This is underpinned by some understanding of religion and belief. Judgements of a limited range of elements in the question are made. Judgements are supported by an attempt to appraise evidence, much of which may be superficial, leading to a conclusion that is not fully justified.

The response was awarded the highest mark in the level because:

The candidate fulfilled the best fit requirements for Level 2.



Focus on judgement and evaluation of the value of the arguments, rather than a personal opinion.

Question 3 (a)

Section 3: Living the Muslim Life


The question in this case was:

Outline **three** purposes of the Ten Obligatory Acts of Shi'a Islam.

The question is focused on the purposes of the acts rather than requiring an outline of what the individual acts are.

The first response is included as an example of a candidate who outlined three of the Obligatory Acts rather than focusing on their purpose for Shi'a Muslims.

Answer the question given, generic facts are rarely what is required.

This candidate did understand that the question required purposes of the Obligatory Acts rather than knowledge of what they are.

One purpose is that they teach shi's musling the most important belieps and actions that should be believed and camed out throughout a muslim's tip. Another purpose is that mey show muslime what to do to please pluch.



The candidate was awarded 2 marks. The candidate outlined two correct purposes.

They teach Shi'a Muslims the most important actions they should do throughout their life (1). They show what to do to please Allah (1).




Always aim for three purposes in your answer.

Question 3 (b)

The question asked:

Explain **two** reasons why reciting the Shahadah is important for Muslims.

In general questions which considered aspects of the Five Pillars were well answered by candidates.

This example was included to illustrate the approach taken by a weaker candidate.

it shows your commitment to the faith and to Allah

as it is one of the 10 Obligatory Acts



The candidate was awarded **1** mark. The candidate gave one simple reason.

It shows your commitment to the faith (1).

The Shahadah is not one of the Ten Obligatory Acts for Shi'a Muslims so the second point offered by the candidate was not credited. This illustrates a common confusion between the Five Roots of Usul Al-Din which are beliefs and the Ten Obligatory Acts which, as the name suggests, are required actions rather than beliefs.



Know the difference between the required beliefs and the required actions.

This example illustrates a common problem, candidates haven given an initial reason, sometimes struggled to effectively develop it.

One reason why the shahadah is important for musins is because it gives them a sense of belonging to Islam as it is a declartion op Faith. It shows that islam is their only religion and practice.

Another important reason as to why the shakadah is important is because it proves acceptence and beliep in one & god alone. Aswell as this it shows belief in Allahs messenger p.b.u.h.



The candidate was awarded 3 marks. The candidate gave one developed and one simple reason.

It gives them a sense of belonging to Islam (1), developed by, as it is a declaration of faith (1).

It proves acceptance and belief in one God alone (1).

The attempted development concerning belief in Prophet Muhammad acted as a separate reason and, since only two reasons can be credited, this was not credited.



Development must relate directly to the initial reason offered.

This example was included to illustrate a full mark response.

The candidate was awarded 4 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons.

It is one of the things that makes a person Muslim (1), developed by, their acceptance of Allah and his messenger (1). It reminds them of their commitment to their faith (1), developed by, that there is only one God, Allah, and believing otherwise is a sin (1).



Having given a reason link the development directly to the reason.

Question 3 (c)

The question was:

Explain **two** reasons why Muslims perform Hajj.

Again since this dealt with one of the Five Pillars it was generally well answered though many candidates struggled to provide an appropriate source of wisdom and authority.

This example is included to illustrate the problems inherent in trying to translate knowledge about Christian reasons for pilgrimage into an Islamic context.

The candidate was awarded 1 mark. The candidate gave one simple reason; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

It can help them feel closer to Allah (1).

The attempted development was not credited since Allah is not a historical figure, he is everywhere.

The second reason offered was not accepted since it is not a Muslim concept. There are reports of miracles in the Qur'an but Muslims do not go on Hajj to be healed of physical ailments.



Remember to keep religions distinct and separate in your answer.

This illustrates the practice engaged in by some candidates of choosing what they feel to be their strongest point and rewriting as a quote. This often bears no relation to the actual words of the Qur'an or Hadith.

The candidate was awarded 4 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

To build a closer, more personal, relationship with Allah (1), developed by, by going on a spiritual journey they help to give Allah what he requires (1). Muslims are able to interact with each other and share their faith and ideas (1), developed by, this helps to strengthen the ummah (1).

The 'quote' is not a genuine quote so it was not accepted.

This candidate achieved full marks by providing two developed reasons, one of which was linked to a relevant source of wisdom and authority from the Qur'an. The candidate did not identify the source as from the Qur'an but this was not required for it to be credited.

The reason why muslims purporm Klajj is to show devotion and dedication to Allah as they are following the Sebigatory pillars. For example " filgramage to the house is a duty owed to God by all those who can undertane It " This quote shows it is a duty & por this reason Musims may perparant.

Another reason why musions perpern Huffesto have all their sins porgiven as this the time in which Allah cleanses all up a persons Sins. A person who property Hay returns as a "Newbern baby" meaning that they are pure and sintess



The candidate was awarded 5 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons; with reference to an appropriate source of authority.

To show devotion and dedication to Allah (1), developed by, as they are following the five obligatory pillars (1). 'Pilgrimage to the house is a duty owed to God by all who can undertake it' (1).

This is from Surah 3:97 and functions as the source of authority.

To have all their sins forgiven (1), developed by, as this is a time when Allah cleanses all a person's sins (1).



Use your source where it is relevant to your developed reason.

Question 3 (d)

The question was:

"Fasting is always valuable for Muslims in modern society."

Evaluate this statement considering arguments for and against.

In your response you should:

- refer to Muslim teachings
- reach a justified conclusion.

In questions one and three candidates will never be asked for a non-Muslim perspective. In this answer many candidates had a sound basis of knowledge and understanding of the value of fasting for Muslims and many applied this effectively to fasting as practiced today.

This is included as an example of a candidate achieving level 2. It considers a range of points and provides an attempt to make a judgement in a personal conclusion though this is not well justified.

The candidate was awarded **9** marks. Level 2, highest mark = 6 SPaG = 3 The candidate gained level 2 because:

Superficial connections are made among many, but not all, of the elements in the question.

This is underpinned by a sound understanding of religion and belief. Judgements of a limited range of elements in the question are made. Judgements are supported by an attempt to appraise evidence, much of which may be superficial, leading to a conclusion that is not fully justified.

The response was awarded the highest mark in the level because:

The candidate showed aspects of level three work but the judgements and justified conclusion were lacking.

SPaG: This was awarded 3 marks because:

The candidate spells and punctuates with consistent accuracy. Candidate uses rules of grammar with effective control of meaning overall. Candidate uses a wide range of specialist terms appropriately.



Focus on judgement and appraisal to achieve the higher levels.

This is included as an example of a candidate awarded at Level 3. Although there was little in the way of judgement and appraisal there was at attempt to critically deconstruct religious teachings.

The candidate was awarded **10** marks. Level 3, lowest mark = 7 SPaG = 3 The candidate gained level 3 because:

Deconstructs religious information/issues, leading to coherent and logical chains of reasoning that consider different viewpoints.

These are underpinned by an accurate understanding of religion and belief. Connections are made among many, but not all, of the elements in the question.

Constructs some reasoned judgements of some of the elements in the question.

The response was awarded the lowest mark in the level because:

Whilst this demonstrated some evidence appropriate to Level 3 there was little evidence of the appraisal of the quality of the arguments offered.

SPaG: This was awarded 3 marks because:


The candidate spells and punctuates with consistent accuracy. Candidate uses rules of grammar with effective control of meaning overall. Candidate uses a wide range of specialist terms appropriately.

Total mark awarded = **10**.



Critical consideration is the key.

This is included as an example of a candidate at the top of Level 1. They offered basic information about Islam on two sides of the argument and offered a basic conclusion.

The candidate was awarded **6** marks. Level 1, highest mark = 3 SPaG = 3 The candidate gained level 1 because:

Information/issues are identified

Superficial connections are made among a limited range of elements in the question, underpinned by isolated elements of understanding of religion and belief.

Judgements are supported by generic arguments to produce a conclusion that is not fully justified.

The response was awarded the highest mark in the level because:

Although there was no attempt at evaluation of the quality of the elements considered the candidate fulfilled the requirements for Level 1.



To progress to the higher levels consider more than one aspect of fasting.

Question 4 (a)

Section 4: Matters of Life and Death

The question was:

Outline **three** Muslim beliefs about euthanasia.

Many candidates answered this very well, very few confused abortion and euthanasia. Those who did less well tended to present facts about euthanasia rather than Muslim beliefs.

Unfortunately this candidate only offered one creditworthy Muslim belief.

requests it and they are certain secondly, non agree that
evenanasia should not be performed because only Allah can
 give or End life lastly, enchanasia is the least-painful

The candidate was awarded 1 mark. The candidate outlined one correct belief.

Only Allah can give or take a life (1).

The first point was not credited as it is not Muslim teaching on euthanasia, since voluntary euthanasia is, in effect, agreeing to assisted suicide which is not accepted by Muslims.

The final point was not credited as it is a definition of euthanasia, not a belief.



The question is about beliefs. Beliefs are rarely facts.

Again this candidate used the opportunity to include factual knowledge about euthanasia rather than beliefs.

The candidate was awarded 2 marks. The candidate outlined two correct beliefs.

The final point was a fact about euthanasia rather than a belief.





Question 4 (b)

The question was:

Explain **two** reasons why most Muslims do not agree with abortion.

Most candidates were able to give two clear reasons in response, many were able to develop their reasons, often using appropriate quotations.

This example is included to demonstrate the work of a candidate who had enough knowledge to produce two developed reasons but, instead, presented the information as a series of simple reasons.

The candidate was awarded 2 marks. The candidate gave two simple reasons.

It is interfering with God's plan (1). He is the giver of life and death (1).

The second reason offered is not used in a way that develops the first one. Similarly the rest of the response gives two further reasons why most Muslims do not agree with abortion and then a fact about ensoulment which does not link to the question or either of the reasons given. Only two reasons can be credited, where a candidate has offered more than two reasons the examiner will credit the best two reasons, checking if another reason provides a development.



Focus on linking development to the initial reason.

The work of this candidate was included to demonstrate how the same information can be used more effectively.

The candidate was awarded 4 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons.

It is interfering in God's plan (1), developed by, life was created by him and should be ended by him (1).

Unlike the previous response the candidate uses the second idea to effectively develop the first. The fact that Allah gives life and should end it develops the idea that abortion would interfere with Allah's plan.

Allah doesn't give a soul more than it can bear (1), developed by, if he gave a child then it is with divine wisdom (1).



Development is the key to success.

Examiners will always mark positively to maximise the marks available to the candidate.

The candidate was awarded 4 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons.

Abortion is a form of murder (1), developed by, murder is a sin (1). Allah will not burden you with something that you cannot handle (1), developed by, everything happens for a reason, including pregnancy (1).

The candidate includes a basic reason in the middle, 'Only Allah should have the power to give or take away life', this basic reason was ignored and the following developed reason credited, in order to maximise the marks awarded to the candidate.



Always aim for two developed reasons. Additional information is unnecessary.

Question 4 (c)

The question was:

Explain **two** reasons why Muslims reject arguments against life after death.

The focus in this question was not what Muslims believe about life after death but rather the kinds of arguments they may use to convince a doubter that their beliefs are real.

The response of this candidate was included to demonstrate the danger of not reading the question carefully enough.

The candidate was awarded 1 mark. The candidate gave 1 basic reason; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

(They believe this because) all of this is stated throughout the Qur'an (1).

Much of this response considers what Muslims believe about life after death, rather than why the arguments against it are wrong.



Make sure you understand the question before you begin your response.

This represents the work of a mid-range candidate who understood the demand of the question but struggled to give two developed reasons.

The candidate was awarded 3 marks. The candidate gave one developed and one basic reason; with no reference to an appropriate source of authority.

The teachings in the Qur'an are correct (1), developed by, they are the words from Allah (1).

Allah judges them after death so there has to be an afterlife (1).

Mention of 'the teachings of the Qur'an' does not constitute a 'source of authority'.



Practice developing simple reasons to increase their value.

The final exemplar in 4c shows the work of a candidate who achieved full marks.

Muslines believe that akirah is real as they send their aves to get into heaven. In the Que'an it says " your actions will be rensorched" this means that there is life after death as it is a reward from Allah. Also, Muslins believe that in life after death because in the Qur'an it speaks of Judgement by. This means that people will be judged their actions and then it will be decided if you go to paradise or hell.



The candidate was awarded 5 marks. The candidate gave two developed reasons; with reference to an appropriate source of authority.

They spend their lives trying to get into heaven (1). The Qur'an says 'Your actions will be rewarded' (paraphrase Surah 28:84, source of authority) (1) developed by, life after death is a reward from Allah (1). The Qur'an speaks of Judgement Day (1), developed by, people will be judged by their actions and it will be decided if you go to heaven or hell (1).



A full mark answer doesn't have to be long, it just has to be accurate.

Question 4 (d)

The final question on the paper was:

"Allah created all living things."

Evaluate this statement considering arguments for and against.

In your response you should:

- refer to Muslim teachings
- refer to non-religious points of view
- reach a justified conclusion.

Again this (d) question required the candidate to consider non-religious views. Many candidates did this very well by including knowledge for their study of the topic in Science.

This is included to illustrate the work of a candidate who gave a simple reason in support of the statement and a simple reason against. The candidate may have been running out of time.

Information/issues are identified Superficial connections are made among a limited range of elements in the question, underpinned by isolated elements of understanding of religion and belief.

The response was awarded the middle mark in the level because:

The candidate made no judgement of the elements offered in the response, there was no conclusion.



Time the paper carefully.

This is included as a candidate who achieved at the mid range of Level 2.

Although they mentioned a range of the elements of the question the scientific component of the response was weak and contained inaccuracies.

The candidate was awarded **5** marks. Level 2, middle mark = 5 The candidate gained level 2 because:

Superficial connections are made among many, but not all, of the elements in the question.

This is underpinned by a limited understanding of religion and belief, containing some inaccuracies (plants would certainly exist without human intervention).

Judgements of a limited range of elements in the question are made.

The response was awarded the middle mark in the level because:

The candidate did not attempt to appraise the evidence, leading to a conclusion that is partially justified.

This was included as an example of a candidate who achieved a mark at Level 3.

The candidate gained Level 3 as a 'best fit' mark because the response contained elements of level three work. The candidate:

Deconstructs religious information/issues, leading to coherent and logical chains of reasoning that consider different viewpoints. These are underpinned by an accurate understanding of religion and belief. Connections are made among many, but not all, of the elements in the guestion.

The response was awarded the lowest mark in the level because:

The candidate made limited judgements of some, but not all, of the elements in the question.

There was no evidence of the appraisal of evidence, leading to a partially justified conclusion.



For more able candidate judgement and appraisal are the key to the higher levels.

Paper Summary

Based on their performance on this paper, candidates are offered the following advice:

- Acquire knowledge and understanding of the fundamental concepts of Muslim belief
- Be aware of how these are applied in society today
- Make sure you read the questions carefully
- Stick to the facts, not opinions
- Be aware of the difference between the belief system of Shi'a Muslims and the Obligatory Acts
- Be aware of the weight of the (d) questions.
