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1 INTRODUCTION AND SECTION ONE

These exemplar items of Spanish Writing scripts and accompanying notes aim to demonstrate the relationship between candidates' work and the assessment criteria for this component. These examples represent just a few approaches from a small number of candidates. They are not intended to be comprehensive and should not be interpreted prescriptively.

These items exemplify different standards of work. They cover work at all grades from Grade G up to Grade A* for this component.


The candidate performs well in both communication and accuracy. One mark is lost for communication in Item 3, but full marks for accuracy.







1.4 COMMENTARIES ON QUESTION 3

Candidate C

Communication. The piece is very simple written but conveys all the required points without ambiguity. 6 marks

Quality of Language. Not quite good enough for full marks but a good effort nonetheless. 6 marks

Total: 12/13

Candidate D

Communication. A very muddled piece but it does mention all the required points. 5 marks

Quality of Language. Over-exuberance leads the candidate to make a number of errors. It is usually better at this level to keep it simple. 4 marks

Candidate E

Communication. In spite of the rather mysterious beginning, the candidate conveys much of the required information. 4 marks

Quality of Language. There are a number of errors, some of which lead to ambiguity. 2 marks

2 SECTION TWO

2.1 MARK SCHEME – SECTION TWO

Communication	10 marks

2.3 COMMENTARIES ON CANDIDATES F AND H

Candidate F

Communication. The candidate has covered all the tasks fully and without ambiguity, using a variety of tenses as required by the context. 10 marks

Quality of Language. Although there are some errors they are heavily outweighed by the number of varied and well-formed verbs and other features. These include the correct use of *ser*, a variety of tenses, the infinitive after *espero*, and even a subjunctive. The candidate uses appropriate vocabulary usually with correct agreements and there are other good features such as *menos de* followed by a number and *más bonita del mundo*. 6 marks

Accuracy. The candidate writes accurately and clearly. 4 marks

Total: 20/20

Candidate G

Communication. Most of the required information is conveyed but there is some ambiguity about the work experience. 8 marks

Quality of Language. The candidate writes in the appropriate register with a good range of tenses. The style is mainly coherent but there are occasional lapses which impede understanding. 5 marks

Accuracy. The writing is accurate enough to give a mainly clear account. 3 marks

Total: 16/20

Candidate H

Communication. The candidate touches on each of the sub-tasks but they are either confused or incomplete. There is no attempt at using a variety of tenses. 3 marks

Quality of Language. The candidate begins well but soon lapses into inaccuracy demonstrating a lack of knowledge of all but the simplest verbs. Nouns and adjectives are used but genders and agreements are erratic. 2 marks

Accuracy. The candidate is given the benefit of the doubt between 0 and 1. 1 mark

3.3 COMMENTARIES ON CANDIDATES J, K AND L

Candidate J

Communication. The writing does not lack clarity but there is no reference to the ideal holiday and no discussion of foreign travel. 6 marks

Quality of language. There is a good variety of structures, vocabulary and idiom. Apart from the confusion of first and third person preterite forms, tenses are used confidently. The candidate writes fluently and consistently. 11 marks

Accuracy. The writing is generally accurate. The candidate uses a good variety of appropriate vocabulary with correct genders and agreements; and adverbs, prepositions, etc. are well used.

5 marks

Total: 22/30

Candidate K

Communication. The candidate touches on all the relevant subject matter but only the holiday description is given in enough detail. At this level some expression of opinion is required, for example, why going to Spain would be an ideal holiday. 8 marks

Quality of language. There is a range of structure, vocabulary and idiom. There are some good examples of verb usage but also some unacceptable errors such as the confusion of the future forms with the preterite. The candidate has also omitted many of the significant verb accents. The vocabulary used, though appropriate, is not varied enough to attract the highest marks at this level. 7 marks

Accuracy. This is a very mixed piece. The candidate shows flair and competence on occasion but is unable to sustain them throughout. 3 marks

Total: 18/30

Candidate L

Communication. The candidate deals with all the required points but on a superficial level. 4 marks

Quality of language. There is a lot of repetition of verb forms, in particular of *gustaría* and a very limited range of verbs generally. The candidate uses a narrow vocabulary with little attempt at using adjectives. The few adverbs used are really very basic and not what one expects of the best candidates at this level. 5 marks

Accuracy. All in all a rather immature piece of writing with little attempt at more mature forms and structures. 2 marks
