Q: What are the GRE Subject Tests?

A: The GRE is the Graduate Record Exam. There are 8 paper-based subject tests in the areas of Biochemistry/Cellular/Molecular Biology, Chemistry, General Biology, Computer Science, Literature in English, Mathematics, Physics and Psychology.

Q: Who requires the GREs?

A: Check with your individual program to see if they require a Subject Test.

Q: When can I take these tests?

A: The Subject Tests are given at paper-based test centers worldwide three times a year in October, November and April.

Q: Where can I take these tests?

A: Vassar is a test location for all 3 administrations. Check online for the most up-to-date listing of testing centers.

Q: How do I register to take a test?

A: You can register for a GRE Subject Test online or by mail.

Q: How much are examination fees?

A: subject tests are \$150 when taken in the United States and any of its territories.

Q: How long will I be at the testing center?

A: Plan to be at the test center up to three and a half hours. Report to the test center 30 minutes before the test begins. If you arrive late, you may not be admitted, and your test fee will be forfeited.

Q: What do I need to take to the test center?

A: Take your admission ticket, your valid photo ID, three or four sharpened soft-lead (No. 2 or HB) pencils, and a good eraser. Mechanical pencils and pens are not permitted.

Q: How can I prepare for a Subject Test?

A: When you register for a Subject Test, you will be sent a free Subject Test Practice Book. Each book includes one actual Subject Test and answer key, test-taking strategies, and information to help you understand the scoring. You can also download each tests' practice book.

Q: I'm not going directly to graduate school. How long are my scores valid for?

A: Test scores can be sent for up to five years following your test year.
