## Drawing or Painting from Still Life

#### **EITHER**

Theme A

Objects required: A filled Rooh-Afza bottle, a Papaya, some Lemon,

Grapes, Oranges, and a Knife.

Arrangements: The papaya

The papaya should be cut into two pieces and placed in front of the bottle of Rooh-Afza, along with the grapes, oranges and lemon. The knife should rest on the piece of papaya, below eye level to form a good composition for a still life study. The arrangement should be placed against a suitably coloured background to contrast with the colour effect of the whole group. If the group is painted, the background must be included.

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#### Theme B

Objects required:

Two soft toys – a Chimpanzee and a Dog; a banana and two small rubber or plastic balls of any colour.

Arrangements:

Arrange the articles to make a good combination.

Suitable coloured drapery must be used for the background and foreground, to contrast with the colour effect of the whole arrangement. If the group is painted, the background must be included.

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
