

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Why choose London Examinations IGCSE English qualifications?

London Examinations IGCSE English qualifications are contemporary courses that have been designed to meet the abilities and ambitions of all your students – from those who want to develop their literacy skills to a first language level, to those who want to improve their competence in English.

Recognition and progression

IGCSE English qualifications are recognised as equivalent, grade for grade, to a UK GCSE and have the same status in terms of university entry requirements. IGCSE senior examiners have experience in examining both GCSE and IGCSE, ensuring that standards are consistent. This qualification provides many progression opportunities. On successful completion, students can choose to further their studies by taking GCE AS and A level English courses, or other equivalent qualifications.

Our IGCSE in English as a Second Language at grade C or above is recognised in the UCAS International Qualifications booklet as evidence of competence in English for UK university admission.

IGCSE English Language

Equal to UK standards

The qualification is modelled on the UK GCSE English, and incorporates the best features of the London Examinations O level English Language. It is marked to the same standard as GCSE English, and as a result can be regarded as a first-language qualification.

Straightforward teaching

Study is based on an anthology of fiction and non-fiction texts which is provided free of charge. The texts have been carefully chosen to illustrate the range of reading required at this level. Through studying these texts students will learn about the conventions of different forms and styles of writing, and can use these as models for their own writing. This approach has the added benefit of helping students prepare for their final exams, as they are assessed on both the anthology pieces they have studied, and their responses to unprepared reading material.

Choice of assessment

This qualification is assessed in the same way as a UK GCSE, with a Foundation tier (grades C to G) or Higher tier (grades A* to D) available to suit students of different abilities.

Students can be entered for either coursework, or for the exam alternative. Those choosing the coursework option are additionally required to submit two assessments to demonstrate their competence at speaking and listening. These are assessed by the teacher, and a free video is provided to give teachers guidance on how to carry out these assessments.

All students must take two assessment components:

- Paper 1F (Foundation tier) or 2H (Higher tier)
- Paper 3 or coursework.

IGCSE English Literature

Global content

A truly international course which introduces students to the in-depth study of prose, poetry and drama. There is a wide choice of titles from prescribed lists of prose and drama texts, and a free anthology of poems is provided for the poetry component of the course. The prescribed texts range from traditional English literature to texts in translation from around the world. With only three texts to study, the course is easily completed in a year, making it the ideal complement to IGCSE English Language.

Choice of assessment

There is a single tier of entry. Students take two assessment components:

- Paper 1 (drama and prose)
- Paper 2 (poetry) or coursework (poetry).

There is a choice of question on each text. Questions are carefully worded to encourage a personal response, supported by knowledge and understanding of the text. Paper 1 (drama and prose) is a 'closed text' exam while Paper 2 (poetry) is an 'open text' exam.

IGCSE English as a Second Language

Higher Education recognition

Designed for students taking a range of IGCSEs and who would find a second language qualification more relevant than IGCSE English Language. It is benchmarked to Level B2 of the Common European Framework, which gives it currency for university entry at grade C and above.

Focused content

While IGCSE English Language assesses responses to a range of reading, including some literary texts, IGCSE English as a Second Language concentrates on non-fiction texts, and the answers required are generally shorter and less inferential. In the reading and listening exercises students are required to skim for overall meaning and to scan for detail. Students are given a clear purpose and audience in all writing tasks.

Choice of assessment

There is a single tier of entry. Students can take two or three assessment components:

- Paper 1 (reading and writing)
- Paper 2 (listening audiotape)
- Paper 3 (spoken test, optional, separately awarded).

The optional **speaking test** is based on task cards which are designed to lead the student from directed speech towards a more free-ranging extended discussion. All speaking tests are audio taped and sent to Edexcel for marking.
