1.8 Describe the position of the major facial bones	<p>1.8.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Occipital • Parietal • Frontal • Temporal • Ethmoid • Sphenoid • Zygomatic • Palatine</li> <li>Lacrimal • Nasal • Turbinate • Vomer • Maxillae • Mandible</li> </ul>

2.1 Select and use products, tools and equipment for photographic make-up application taking into account identified factors	<p>2.1.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Skin colour • Skin type • Skin texture • Hair colour • Eye colour • Face shape • Facial features</li> <li>• Condition of skin • Allergies to products • Effects required • Occasion • Individual age and wishes • Fashion and cultural trends</li> </ul>
2.2 State tools, equipment and products used when carrying out a photographic make-up application	<p>2.2.1 To include:</p> <p><b>Products</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Foundations – cream, liquid, mousse, gel, block / compact / cake, all-in-one, light reflecting, matt • Concealer – stick / pot, tube / wand / pen • Powders – loose, pressed, coloured powders • Contour cosmetics – cream, gel, stick, powder, shaders, highlighters</li> <li>• Blushers – cream, powder • Eye shadows – cream, powder, water colour (cake), pencil</li> <li>Eye liners – liquid, crayon / pencil, cake / block, kohl • Mascara – block / cake, liquid, cream</li> <li>• Lipsticks – lip sticks, lip gloss, lip pencils / liner, tube, pot</li> </ul> <p><b>Tools</b> Sponges</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Brushes • Artist palette • Spatulas • Lash comb • Sharpener</li> </ul> <p><b>Equipment</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mirror • Light • Head band / clips</li> </ul>
2.3 Describe the factors that need to be considered when carrying out a photographic make-up application	<p>2.3.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Skin type • Bone structure • Age of skin • Range of products • Lighting • End result required</li> </ul>

2.4 Describe the sequence in which make-up products should be applied	<p>2.4.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Applying moisturiser • Applying pre-base • Corrective creams • Foundation • Concealer • Powder • Shader • Highlighter • Eye shadow • Eyeliner • Mascara • Blusher • Lip liner • Lipstick • Lip gloss where appropriate</li> </ul>
2.5 Apply a photographic make-up application	<p>2.5.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assisting the client on to a couch or seating the client in an upright or slightly reclined position in good / natural light • Removing jewellery / accessories as appropriate</li> <li>• Storing the client's valuables in a safe place • Covering / protecting the client appropriately for the treatment • Securing hair off the face • Checking for contraindications • Cleansing, toning and moisturising according to skin type • Applying photographic make-up • Checking result and add any finishing touches • Removing head band / clips • Showing client result in a mirror • Ensuring that the result meets with client's satisfaction</li> </ul>
2.6 Evaluate effectiveness of the photographic make-up application	<p>2.6.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Working to a brief • Producing a design and developing images • Lighting and camera effects • Evaluating results against design objective</li> </ul>
2.7 State methods of evaluating the effectiveness of the application of the make-up	<p>2.7.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Designing objectives • Suitability of overall result • Asking for feed-back from the rest of the team • Checking self-development • Evaluating and comparing development progress and final result with the original client specification • Recording results of evaluation for future reference • Self reflecting on make-up application</li> </ul>
2.8 Provide suitable aftercare advice	<p>2.8.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintaining make-up • Removing make-up • Homecare routine</li> </ul>
2.9 Describe the aftercare that should be provided	<p>2.9.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintaining make-up • Removing make-up • Home care routine</li> </ul>
2.10 Follow safe and hygienic working practices	<p>2.10.1 To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wiping equipment over with appropriate sanitiser before and after use • Sanitising hands before, during and after treatment as appropriate • Replacing lids on products</li> <li>• Disposing of waste hygienically and appropriately • Demonstrating correct use of salon sterilising equipment / cabinets • Storing sanitised / sterilised equipment appropriately</li> <li>• Using fresh laundered towels for each client • Using freshly laundered gowns for each client</li> <li>• Ensuring that the floor / trolleys / surfaces are clean and sanitised where appropriate</li> </ul>

2.11 Outline safe and hygienic working practices when carrying out photographic make-up application	2.11.1 To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Using clean sponges • Decanting all make-up products onto a palette before application</li> <li>• Using clean tissues and cotton wool • Washing and sterilising brushes • Sharpening lip and eye pencils between use • Using disposable mascara brushes and not reloading them</li> <li>• Using sterilised or disposable applicators</li> </ul>
2.12 Communicate and behave in a professional manner	2.12.1 To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Being polite at all times • Being honest • Showing a positive attitude when asked to help</li> <li>• Offering help without having to be asked • Showing enthusiasm for the job • Demonstrating positive facial expressions • Demonstrating positive body language • Demonstrating good eye contact • Listening • Speaking clearly</li> </ul>
