μάχη: battle. σῶμα: body. ἕλκω: I drag. στρατόπεδον: camp. καταβήσομαι: I will go down. ἀπάξω: I will bring back. ἄμαξα: wagon. χρυσός: gold. σκηνή: tent. ἄξιος (+ Genitive Case): worthy of.

γυνή τις, ὀνόματι Φαίδρα, τῆ κρήνη προσχωρεῖ. δούλη ἀκολουθεῖ. ἡ δὲ δούλη μεγάλην ὑδρίαν φέρει. κάμνει δὲ ἡ δούλη καὶ, "ὧ δέσποινα," φησίν, "μὴ οὕτω ταχέως βάδιζε· μεγάλη ἐστιν ἡ ὑδρία, καὶ οὐ ῥάδιόν ἐστι σπεύδειν." ἡ δὲ Φαίδρα, "μὴ φλυάρει, ὧ δούλη," φησίν, "ἀλλὰ σπεῦδε. καιρὸς γάρ ἐστιν ὕδωρ καὶ σῖτον φέρειν πρὸς τὸν δεσπότην."

ή μὲν οὖν γυνὴ καὶ ἡ δούλη βαδίζουσι πρὸς τὴν κρήνην. <u>πληροῦσι</u> δὲ τὴν ὑδρίαν καὶ βαδίζουσι πρὸς τὸν ἀγρόν. ἐπεὶ δὲ ὁ δεσπότης ὁρᾳ τὴν γυναῖκα καὶ τὴν δούλην, οὐκέτι πονεῖ ἀλλὰ καθίζει ὑπὸ τῷ δένδρῳ καὶ <u>δειπνεῖ</u>.

ἀκολουθέω: I follow. δέσποινα: mistress. φλυαρέω: I talk nonsense. καιρός: time, the right time. πληρόω: I fill. δειπνέω: I eat.
