ὁ Ἀπόλλων, Διὸς υἱὸς καὶ Λητοῦς, θεὸς ἦν φέγγους. τοῦ δ' ἡλίου ζῶην διδόντος, τῶν νεανιῶν φύλαξ ἦν Ἀπόλλων, ἀγῶσί τε καὶ τῇ παλαίστρᾳ ἐπισκοπῶν. σημεῖον δὲ τούτου τόξον φέρει καὶ φαρέτραν. ἔτι δὲ καὶ τῆς μαντικῆς θεὸς ὢν Δελφοῦς ᾧκει, ἣ δ' ἰέρεια αὐτοῦ τοῖς ἀνθρώποις τὰ μέλλοντα ἔσσεσθαι προεῖπεν. ἐπεὶ δὲ ἡ μαντικὴ καὶ ἡ μουσικὴ κοινόν τι ἔχειν φαίνονται, λύραν φέρει, καὶ ἐν ταῖς τῶν θεῶν θυσίαις φορμίζει, καὶ τὸν τῶν Μουσῶν χορὸν εἰσάγει.

A. Translate into English: (40)

Ὀδυσσεὺς ἦν υἱὸς Λαέρτου, Ἰθάκην δ' ᾧκει, νῆσον ὀλίγην μὲν, φίλην δέ. ἔγημε δὲ Πηνελόπην, καὶ υἱὸν εἶχε Τηλέμαχον. ἐκ δὲ τῶν θεῶν Ἀθηνᾶν μάλιστ' ἐτίμησεν. ἐπὶ δὲ Ἴλιον ἔλθων ἐν μὲν πολέμῳ ἀνδρεῖον ἐν δὲ βουλῇ σοφὸν ἑαυτὸν παρεῖχε, καὶ ἐν τοῖς κινδύνοις οὕτως εὐπορος ἦν ὥστε ὑπὸ Ὀμήρου πολύτροπος καλεῖσθαι.
μετὰ δὲ τὴν Ἰλίου ἄλωσιν ἐπανῆλθεν εἰς Ἰθάκην.

- (ii) Write a short note about Athena.

3. Translate into English:

[80]

(King Aiolos gave Odysseus a bag with the winds inside it, to help him sail home. When Odysseus' comrades open the bag, causing an unexpected return to Aiolos' island, Aiolos is less helpful.)

ἐπεὶ δ' οἱ ἑταῖροι τὸν ἄσκον λύουσιν, οἱ ἄνεμοι τὴν ναῦν εἰς τὴν τοῦ Αἰόλου νῆσον αὐθις φέρουσιν. ὁ δ' Ὀδυσσεὺς βαίνει πρὸς τὸν τοῦ βασιλέως οἶκον. ὁ δ' Αἴολος, ὄρων αὐτόν, θαυμάζει καὶ, “ὦ Ὀδυσσεῦ,” φησί, “τί πάσχεις; διὰ τί αὐθις δεῦρο ἦκεις;” ὁ δ' Ὀδυσσεὺς λέγει, “οἱ ἑταῖροι αἵτιοί εἰσιν, ὦ Αἴολε· ἀλλὰ βοήθει ἡμῖν, ὦ φίλε.” ὁ δ' Αἴολος, “ἄπιθι ταχέως,” φησὶν· “οὐ γὰρ δυνατόν ἐστι βοηθεῖν ὑμῖν· οἱ γὰρ θεοὶ ὑμᾶς μισοῦσιν.” ὁ οὖν Ὀδυσσεὺς καὶ οἱ ἑταῖροι ἀπὸ τῆς νήσου ἀποπλεύουσιν.

ἄσκος: bag. ἄνεμος: wind. αὐθις: again. θαυμάζω: I am amazed.
ἦκω: I have come. αἵτιος: responsible. ἄπιθι: go away! μισέω: I hate. ἀποπλέω:
I sail away.

4. Read the following passage and then answer *any six* of the questions which follow:

[80]

(Kodros saves Athens by sacrificing his own life.)

ὁ Κόδρος ἐστὶ βασιλεὺς τῶν Ἀθηναίων. ἀνὴρ οὕτω σοφός ἐστιν ὥστε πάντες τῶν τε πολιτῶν καὶ τῶν συμμάχων αὐτόν φιλοῦσι καὶ τιμῶσιν. ἐπεὶ δ' οἱ πολέμιοι πέμπουσι στρατιάν μεγάλην πρὸς τὰς Ἀθήνας, ὁ Κόδρος κελεύει ἀγγέλους βαίνειν πρὸς Δελφοὺς πρὸς τὸ μαντεῖον.

ὁ δὲ θεὸς τοῖς ἀγγέλοις λέγει τάδε· “οἱ Ἀθηναῖοι ἔξουσι τὴν νίκην εἰ οἱ πολέμιοι ἀποκτενοῦσι τὸν Κόδρον αὐτόν.” ἔπειτα δ' οἱ ἀγγελοὶ πρὸς τὰς Ἀθήνας ἐπανέρχονται.

ὁ δὲ Κόδρος, ἐπεὶ ταῦτα ἀκούει, λέγει τοῖς Ἀθηναίοις· “ἔτοιμός εἰμι ἀποθνήσκειν καὶ σῶζειν τὴν πατρίδα.”

ὁ οὖν Κόδρος μόνος στρατεύει πρὸς τοὺς πολεμίους καὶ ἀποθνήσκει. οὕτως οὖν σῶζει τὰς Ἀθήνας.

σύμμαχος: ally. μαντεῖον: oracle. ἔξουσι: will have. εἰ: if.
ἀποκτενοῦσι: will kill. ἔτοιμος: ready. στρατεύω: I march.

- (b) Why do all the citizens and allies love and honour Kodros?
- (c) Where does Kodros order the messengers to go?
- (d) What does the god say to the messengers?
- (e) When he hears what the god said, what does Kodros tell the Athenians?
- (f) What does Kodros do then?
- (g) Give the Genitive Case, Singular Number of *two* of the following nouns:
ἄγγελος, μαντεῖον, στρατιά, βασιλεύς.
- (h) The word *hippopotamus* comes from two Greek words. What are they, and what does each Greek word mean?
