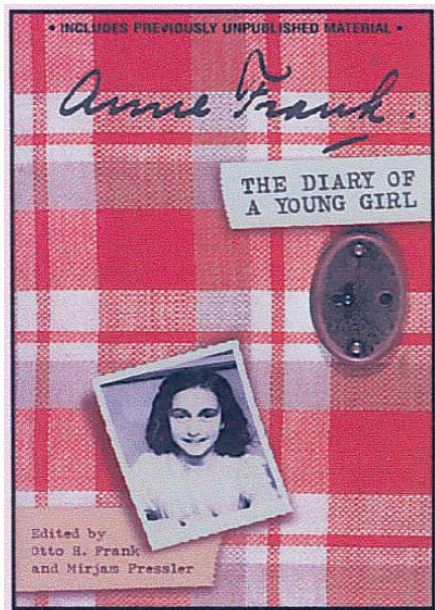


March 2005: The 60th Anniversary of the death of **ANNE FRANK**

Anne Frank was born seventy-six years ago on 12th June 1929. She died in Bergen-Belsen concentration camp in Germany in March 1945.




Anne Frank is famous for her diary in which she recorded her life hiding in the Secret Annexe from 1942 until 1944.

The story of Anne Frank still has important lessons to teach us today. The discrimination and racism that brought an end to her life did not disappear with the end of World War II. Reading her life story can help us realise the value of tolerance and respect and the importance of human rights.

Today people are still being persecuted and murdered because they, just like Anne, are different.

At the Anne Frank House museum, keeping the memory of Anne Frank alive is directly connected to the concepts of '*freedom*', '*human rights*' and '*democracy*'.

What is a Student Council?

A Student Council is a representative structure for students only, through which they can become involved in the affairs of the school, working in partnership with school management, staff and parents for the benefit of the school and its students.

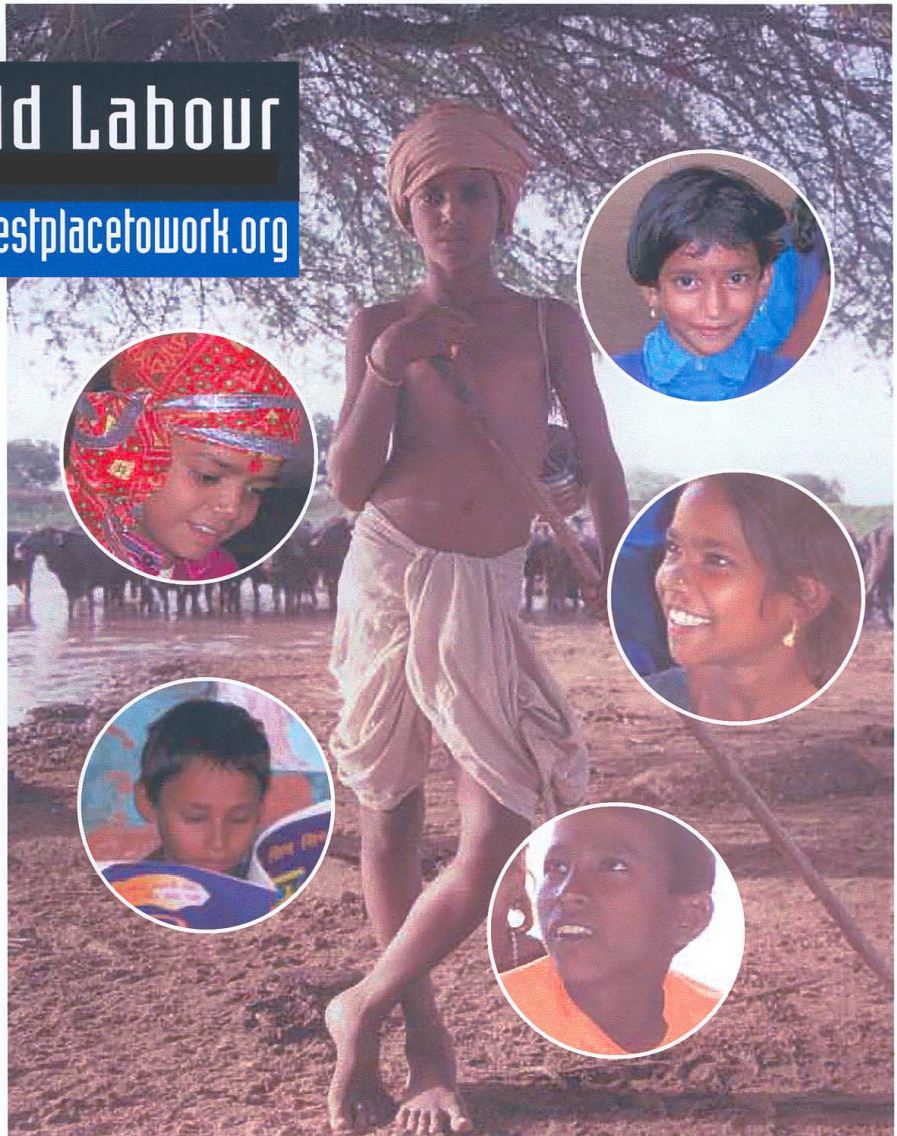
Does your school have the right to set up a student council?

The Education Act 1998 states that Boards of Management must encourage and give all reasonable assistance to students in the formation and running of student councils. The National Children's Strategy states that children and young people will have a voice in matters that affect their lives and be provided with opportunities to participate in decision making.

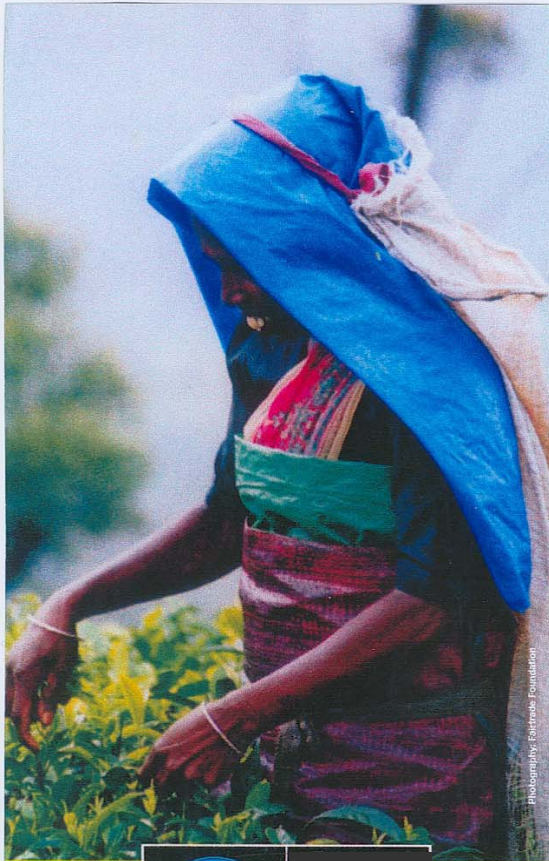
Facts and Figures



Child Labour involves children in the making of bricks, working with machinery in agriculture and carpet weaving, in domestic labour, in the sex industry, in construction work, in deep-sea fishing and in the making of matches and fireworks and hundreds of other activities that deny children the right to full-time education.

1 in every 6 people aged between 5 and 17 years is defined as a child labourer

A TASTE FOR LIFE

It takes a woman (tea pluckers are usually women) sixteen pluckings to pick enough tea for a single cup of tea. The delicate tea leaves are collected in woven baskets.

The daily wages of the pluckers depend on the amount of tea leaves they pick.

Unfortunately, as with many other products we buy from Third World producers, the prices paid to tea producers have not gone up in over forty years.

Tea pluckers receive a bonus for the tea sold under Fairtrade conditions. This bonus allows them to improve their housing, electricity and water supply.
