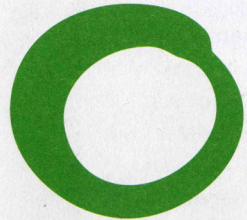

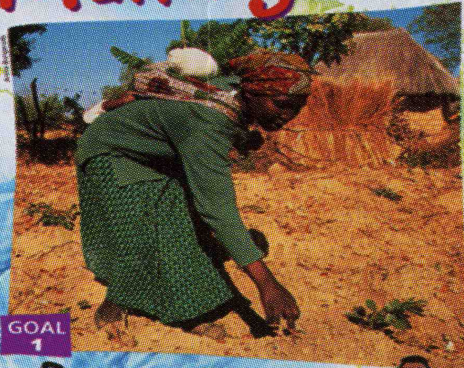

Making the world a fairer place: Millennium Development Goals



GOAL 1

Poverty and hunger

By 2015, halve the number of people who:

- live on less than €1 a day
- suffer from hunger.



GOAL 2

Education

By 2015, make sure that all children start and finish primary school



GOAL 3

Girls

By 2015, make sure that as many girls as boys go to school



GOAL 4

Infants

By 2015, cut by two thirds the number of children who die before they are 5 years old



GOAL 5

Mothers

By 2015, cut by three quarters the number of women who die when they are having babies.



GOAL 6

Diseases

By 2015, stop terrible diseases from spreading, and make them less common



GOAL 7

Environment

- By 2015,
- halve the number of people without clean water
 - improve the lives of 100 million people who live in slums
 - begin to save the good things of creation

Working Together

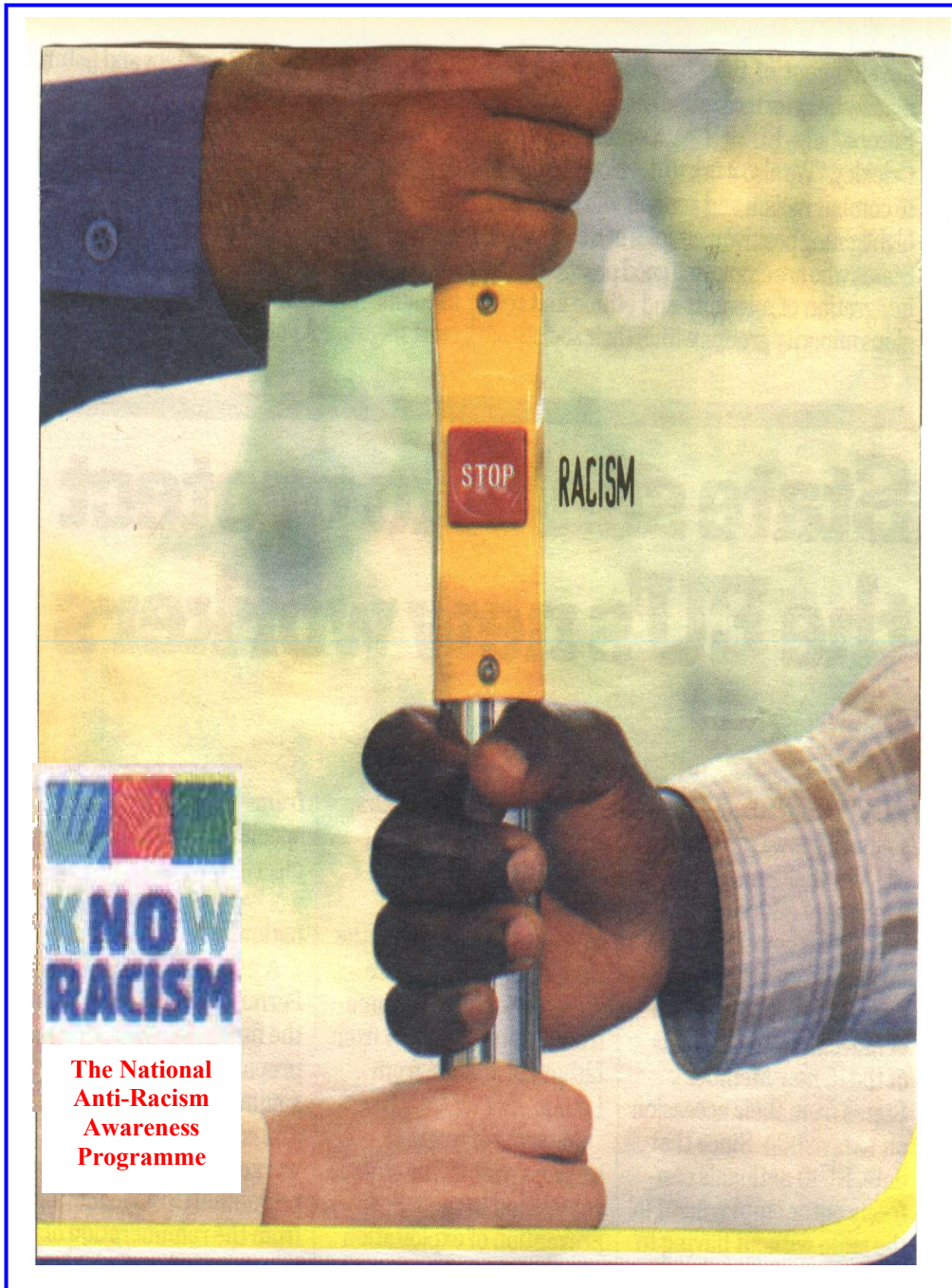
By 2015, all the nations to work together to help poorer nations receive a fair share of the world's wealth
