

Jo:	What was it like growing up in Ireland in the 1950s?
Mr Murphy:	Things were very different then, compared to how they are today, in many ways.
Jo:	What about religious practice, has that changed much since the 1950s?
Mr Murphy:	The way people practice their religion has changed a lot. When I was young most people attended religious services every week. In my family we went to Mass every Sunday. The whole family would get up early and put on our best clothes. We would go without any breakfast because we had to fast before receiving Holy Communion. My mother and sisters always wore scarves on their heads when they went to religious services.
Jo:	Did you enjoy going to religious services with your family every week?
Mr Murphy:	Yes I did. I enjoyed spending time with my family and it also gave me a chance to meet my friends and everyone in my parish. However participating in religious services then was different to how it is today.
Jo:	In what way was it different?
Mr Murphy:	For a start, Mass was said in Latin which I did not understand so, as you can imagine, I found it very hard to be involved. The priest had his back to the people and they were not as involved in the prayers during Mass. Whereas today when I go to Mass the priest is facing me, he is speaking a language that I can understand and I can be more actively involved.
Jo:	Do you still go to religious services every week?
Mr Murphy:	Yes I do. I believe it is very important to be active in my parish and I still enjoy meeting my family and friends at religious services. Unfortunately I see less people at religious services each week and this makes me very sad.
