



*The following is an interview about how a family coped with a robbery.*

READ THE INTERVIEW CAREFULLY AND ANSWER ALL THE QUESTIONS THAT FOLLOW.

Interviewer: Tell us what happened when your house was broken into.

Dara: I came home from school to find the front door open and all our furniture thrown around inside the house. I could hear Mam in the kitchen talking on the phone to a Garda.

Interviewer: Was anything missing?

Dara: It was mostly money and jewellery that was taken. Worst of all, Gran's jewellery was taken from her room. Mam and I didn't know how we were going to tell her that her wedding ring was gone.

Interviewer: How did your grandmother react when she found out?

Dara: At first she was shocked and upset. I got really cross when I saw how hurt she was. Whoever took her ring must have seen the words on it: '*from your loving husband on our wedding day - 1960*'. Later when I brought her a cup of tea, she wanted to know if I was okay.

Interviewer: And were you okay?

Dara: I was really upset and full of anger that someone would take Gran's wedding ring.

Interviewer: How did your grandmother cope with the shock?

Dara: Gran got over the shock but she didn't like to see me so upset. She said she had prayed about it and wanted to forgive whoever took her ring. She felt there was no point in letting anger spoil her memories of Grandad.

Interviewer: Did your grandmother's faith help her to cope with the robbery?

Dara: We talked about it. She said it was wrong to steal. But at the same time Gran said she would not like to think badly of others just because she had been treated badly herself. She believes you have to treat others as you would like to be treated yourself, even when it hurts.

Interviewer: How have you been influenced by your grandmother's reaction to the robbery?

Dara: I think she's right. You can't just forgive people when it's easy. You also have to forgive them when it's hard. I wish the break-in hadn't happened, but I think Gran is wise in the way she has coped with it.
