





Letter to the Editor

Dear Sir,

According to recent reports there has been an increase of almost 50% in public order offences in some parts of the city. This is a disturbing reality particularly when we must assume that there is a similar trend countrywide. There is no doubt that alcohol is a major contributory factor to these offences especially at weekends.

With the current downturn in the economy my greatest fear is that the government will cut back on funding to tackle the chronic alcohol problem which exists in our society. The evidence from reports and studies indicates that there is generally an increase in alcohol related problems in periods of economic downturn.

Due to the large tax income from the sale of alcohol there may be a temptation to ignore the dangerous implications and side affects for those affected by alcohol abuse.

Each year alcohol related problems are costing Irish society in the region of €3 billion per year. It would be impossible to calculate the cost of the emotional and psychological

damage! Within the education system there is a need to introduce programmes in schools that teach about healthy lifestyles, that consistently encourage low volume drinking and non-drinking of alcohol and that promote self-confidence and self-esteem.

In the wider community there is a need to strictly enforce controlled access to alcohol and to punish those who break these laws.



(b) Obesity – A growing threat to our children and our economy

It is estimated that one in five children (20%) is overweight and one in ten (10%) is obese! Overweight and obese children are very likely to become obese adults. However, they have a better chance of becoming healthy weight adults if the problem is recognised and treated in childhood.

Obesity has trebled since the 1980's and places a very serious burden on the health services. Overweight and obese children have a higher risk of developing serious health problems in later life. Obesity can decrease a person's lifespan by nine years! Research suggests that the main reason for the growing obesity epidemic is a combination of lack of activity and eating too much high calorie foods.

Question C2: My Community (15 marks)

The County and Town Express – Parish Notes

Fifty people gathered at the local community hall to organise a campaign to have a playground built in their community. Mary O'Mahony, a mother of three childrem, said that she is terrified that her children will get injured in the park as it has become a dumping ground for bottles, cans and cigarette butts from late night parties. She also pointed out that the surface is uneven and dangerous. "All I want is a safe and stimulating place for

my children to play in and I would like to see this happen before my children are teenagers", she said. Mrs. Brid Crowley, the organiser of the meeting, stated that despite the allocation of grants to local authorities in 2004 for the specific provision of playgrounds nothing has been provided in the area. She stated that the government only provided €2 million for the entire country and that this was around

the amount that an average golf club spends annually on the upkeep of their clubhouse and course. Councillor Barrett highlighted the fact that the playground grant scheme is still in place and that groups may apply for a grant accompanied by a proposal. He said that 'as a community it is our job to take action to ensure a safe play environment for our children now and in the future.'


