Question C1: Social and Health Education (15 marks)

1. LUNG CANCER NOW CLAIMS MORE LIVES THAN BREAST CANCER

Lung cancer now claims more lives than breast cancer according to a report from the National Cancer Registry in Ireland. The most shocking thing about this news is that lung cancer is almost entirely preventable. This report called for renewed efforts to tackle tobacco use. It is true that here in Ireland we have made major strides in the war against smoking with measures such as the work-place ban on smoking but challenges remain. While rates have declined, around twenty five percent of people in Ireland still smoke. The key challenge is how to prevent young people from getting the habit early. Smoking rates are highest among young adults aged between twenty five and thirty four. The SLÁN survey carried out in recent years showed that smoking rates among girls aged between fifteen and seventeen years is up to eight percent higher than in boys in the same age group.

Divided Opinion on Proposed Drilling


