Life Sketching

Pose 1 20 Marks

Sort Pose (15 mins): a wide range of approach is acceptable including swift gesture drawings.

Materials may include a variety of papers and media including pencil, graphite, charcoal, ink and brush, crayons, paint, conte, etc. The combining of various media and materials is acceptable. How the 2D representation suggests the 3D solidity of the 5 Form/Volume body through the use of any medium or technique, or a. combination, including line. Shading/Line 5 b. Use of light and shade in chosen medium and materials as an integral aspect of the drawing. Pose 2 30 Marks

Long Pose (30 mins): a more detailed study of the body: head and shoulders or complete figure. Both very detailed drawings and strong expressive drawing are acceptable.

Materials may include a variety of papers and media including pencil, graphite, charcoal, ink and brush, crayons, paint, conte, etc. The combination of various media and materials is acceptable.
