QUESTION 1.

- * A Car Park
- * A Golf Course

- * A Post Office
- * The Built up area of Cashel
- * A Named stream

- (ii) Cashel is well served by a network of roads. Discuss this statement, with reference to the map evidence only. (30 marks)
- (iii) The rural area outside of the town of Cashel has many antiquities (historic sites). Discuss this statement, using map evidence only. (20 marks)


PHYSICAL GEOGRAPHY

QUESTION 2. GLACIATED LANDSCAPES

 - * Name a specific location where the feature may be found.

(ii) Describe any TWO ways that man has benefited from glacial landforms.

(20 marks)

QUESTION 3. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES

Ozone damage, Acid rain, Greenhouse effect.

- (i) Select any <u>TWO</u> of the above issues and describe their impact on the environment.
- (40 marks)
- (ii) For EACH OF THE TWO selected, explain how Man can reduce the negative impact.

(40 marks)

• QUESTION 4. THE PHYSICAL WORLD

Explain **TWO** of the following statements in some detail:

- (i) Erosion by the sea has resulted in distinctive landscape features.
- (40 marks)

(ii) Misuse of the soil can lead to soil erosion.

(40 marks)

(iii) The Burren is Ireland's best known limestone region.

(40 marks)

(iv) Irish weather is influenced by many factors.

(40 marks)

QUESTION 5. EARTH MOVEMENTS

(i) Earthquake, Volcano, Fold Mountains.

- Describe and explain, with the aid of a diagram, how it occurs.

(ii) With reference to examples you have studied describe the effects of a volcanic eruption or an earthquake on human society.

QUESTION 6. AERIAL PHOTOGRAPH (WITH ORDNANCE SURVEY MAP)

Examine the aerial photograph which accompanies this question:

- (i) Draw a sketch map of the aerial photograph of Cashel and on it show and name the following:
 - * A Car Park

- * 2 Connecting Streets.
- * A historic Building
- * A Commercial / Industrial Area
- * A modern Housing Estate
- * A Rock Outcrop.

(30 marks)

[Note: The sketch map should not be a tracing and should be smaller than the photograph].

- (ii) Suggest a suitable site for a new supermarket in the Town of Cashel and mark the site on your sketch map.

 Use evidence from the photograph only to justify your selection. (30 marks)
- (iii) What evidence is there on both the map and the photo that Cashel is a major tourist attraction?

(20 marks)

[N.B. In part (iii) you have to use both the photograph and the map]

QUESTION 7. WORLD HUNGER



- (i) A number of factors contribute to world hunger, some are listed below:

(ii) Explain how Ireland plays its part in the fight against world hunger. (20 marks)

QUESTION 8. POPULATION STUDIES

On the Sunday evening of 28th April 1996 households all over the Republic of Ireland filled in the Census form.

(i) Outline two reasons why it is important to complete the census of population.

(30 marks)

- (ii) The 1996 Census revealed that 40% of Ireland's population is under 25. Describe one positive and one negative aspect of a youthful population. (30 marks)
- (iii) 25 years ago there were 35% of adult women in the labour force in Ireland. Now there are 70% of women in the labour force. Is this development significant and if so why?

QUESTION 9. THE HUMAN WORLD

Select ANY TWO of the following statements and examine them in detail:

- (i) There are positive and negative consequences of rapid urbanisation. (40 marks)
- (ii) Language and religion are key characteristics of peoples. (40 marks)
- (iii) Political boundaries have given rise to many conflicts. (40 marks)
- (iv) The role of women in Irish society is changing rapidly. (40 marks)

(i) Explain TWO advantages that forestry brings to the Irish economy. (40 marks)

(ii) There is growing concern at the loss of the Tropical Rain Forests.

Explain TWO reasons for this concern.

QUESTION 12. ENERGY

Fossil fuels will not last forever so it is time to take alternative sources of energy seriously.

(i) Describe and explain TWO alternative sources of energy. (40 marks)

(ii) During Energy Awareness Week we were informed that energy saving begins in the home.

Describe TWO ways in which energy can be saved in homes.
