General Principles

Sections A & D (Short Answer Questions 5Marks x 8)

<u>Core</u> = basic element of fact or relevant answer = 5M

Questions involving judgement in the answer may be awarded from 1M to 5M.

Marking = 8 items. (If more than 8 attempted, award 8 highest) 8 x 5M = 40 M

Sections B & F (Paragraph Questions 20Marks x 2)

Marking

Cumulative Mark (CM) = 15M

- Break up the paragraph into points using ticks.
- Put a tick at the end of the final word of the completed point.
- Award each completed point 5M.
- The final point in a paragraph may be marked as follows:

Very good: 4-5.	Good: 2-3.	Poor: 0-1
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Definition of a Point

- (a) A relevant significant statement or an explanation, comment, opinion.
- (b) A relevant significant introductory statement.
