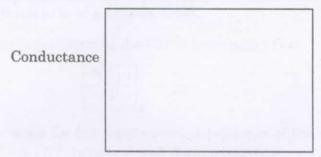

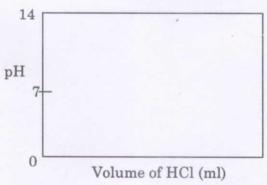

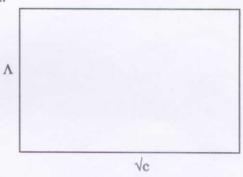


Volume of NaCl solution added (ml)
