Candidates are required to answer question 1 (40 marks) and 3 of the remaining 4 questions (20 marks each).

1. You have a client, Robert Allison, who provides pest control services. He employs teams of workers who inspect industrial and commercial premises, locate the infestation sources, destroy the pests and vermin, usually by means of sprays or poison and generally remove all evidence of the infestation. He will also carry out follow-up 'preventative' visits to ensure the problems do not return. He is presently trading as Acme Pest Control but wishes to change this to something a little more eye-catching. He has thought of two new names, BUGBUSTERS and BUGS R US and has asked you to carry out searches on them both. Once he has received your advice he will use only one of the names both as a trading style and as a service mark on his vans, invoices, letter-heading and advertising flyers.

Also, for the past eighteen months, Mr. Allison has sold, under the trade mark ROACHROAST, an electrically powered gadget for destroying cockroaches. It can run on either mains or battery power. He now wishes to register that mark. In February this year, the marketing manager for the ROACHROAST product left Mr. Allison's employ to form his own company, Triad Limited.

The ROACHROAST product falls in Class 9, non-electrical insect traps in Class 21 and pest and vermin control services in Class 37. Copies of the relevant search reports are attached.

Write a letter to Mr. Allison advising on his freedom to use and to register BUGBUSTERS and BUG R US, including advice on the inherent registrability of each mark and the results of the ROACHROAST search and on the steps which he could now take to obtain registration of the mark.

You receive an Official Action from the Trade Mark Registrar regarding your clients' application for the trade mark BIG FOOT which has been applied for in Class 25 in relation to 'all goods in Class 25'. You are aware that your clients actually use the trade mark BIG FOOT on 'T' shirts and have done so for the past seven years.

Prepare a letter of advice to your client giving an opinion on the objections raised, whether they can be overcome and how, including any additional information that you will require to deal with the official action.

The text of the relevant passages of the examination report is as follows:-

Result of the examination of the Application 1,500,000 in Class 25 under the Trade Marks Act 1938 (as amended) and the Trade Marks and Service Marks Rules 1986 is as follows:-

Acceptability in Part A of the Register (Section 9)

The mark is not deemed to be acceptable for registration in Part A of the Register because it is considered to be descriptive and therefore unregistrable in respect of clothing adapted for big feet.

Acceptability in Part B of the Register (Section 10)

The mark does not appear to be acceptable for registration in Part B of the Register because it is not deemed to be capable of distinguishing the applicants goods from those of other traders because it would be considered to be descriptive of clothing adapted for big feet.

Deceptiveness/morality (Section 11)

The mark as applied for is objectionable under this section of the Act because it would be deemed to be misdescriptive and therefore unregistrable if used on products other than those for use on the feet.

Result of search for conflicting marks (Section 12)

The following registered marks are considered to conflict with this application and are therefore cited under Section 12 (1) of the Act:-

1,000,000 1,100,000, 1,200,000.

Further details of these marks can be found on the attached computer printouts.

Specification of Goods

The specification, as applied for, appears to be too wide and is objectionable under Rule 21. You are requested to indicate the applicant's actual goods of interest.

Final Acceptance

Final acceptance of any mark is reserved for the Registrar, normally acting through his acceptance committee. All marks put forward for advertisement are first scrutinized by the acceptance committee and the possibility of further objection being raised at that stage, or amendments being requested, cannot be ruled out.

3. The trade mark SILK SNIP No. 1199631 was applied for on 5 July, 1981 for leather goods in Class 18 by a company called Amani Ltd. It was actually placed on the register on the 3 June, 1982. Amani Ltd. did not use this trade mark in the U.K. In August, 1988, Amani Ltd. sold registration No. 1199631 to two new joint proprietors, Better Leathergoods Ltd. who intended to manufacture leather goods and Clever Marketing Ltd. who intended to sell the products manufactured by Better Leathergoods Ltd. under the trade mark SILK SNIP.

Your client, Better Leathergoods Ltd., has a copy of the assignment, but informs you that no application was ever made to record this assignment at the U.K. Trade Mark Registry.

In April, 1989 Clever Marketing Ltd. asked your client to make up some samples of leather bags, bearing the trade mark SILK SNIP, which Clever Marketing Ltd. then showed in May, 1989, to the well-known cigarette company Silk Snip Ltd., who sell cigarettes under the name SILK SNIP in the U.K., with a view to interesting them in the sale of the SILK SNIP leather goods for promotional use etc. Your client advises you that nothing further came of this demonstration.

The Trade Mark Registration No. 1199631 was duly renewed in 1988. Clever Marketing Ltd. went into receivership in 1990. Your client advises you that it started to manufacture and sell on

its own account leather goods under the trade mark SILK SNIP on 1st June, 1991, only to learn two weeks ago from Amani's solicitors that on 1st October, 1991 Silk Snip Ltd. had applied to cancel Registration No. 1199631 on the grounds of non-use.

Your client seeks your advice as to its position.

You carry out your own search which reveals that Silk Snip Ltd. applied to register the trade mark SILK SNIP in Class 18 in respect of leather goods in June, 1989.

Make notes regarding the advice that you would give your client with regard to its freedom to use the trade mark SILK SNIP on leather goods in the U.K.

Advise what further information you would need to advise your client fully on any action that should be taken to defend registration no. 1199631 and your client's prospects of success.

4. You act for Schwartzkopf Inc., a U.S. toy company. It has a wholly owned U.K. subsidiary company, Gungho Games Limited, which it acquired in May, 1991. Gungho Games Limited manufactures a board game on the theme of desert warfare which it calls DESERT CONFLICT. The game was first sold in the U.K. in Spring 1985. In 1988 Gungho Games applied in the United Kingdom to register the trade mark DESERT CONFLICT for board games. The application met with the objections that the mark was descriptive of games on the subject of desert warfare and deceptive unless used upon such goods.

Gungho Games proceeded to amend the application by the addition of their registered trade mark GUNGHO to the mark and the inclusion of a disclaimer to exclusive rights to the use of the words DESERT CONFLICT. The application was then able to proceed to registration.

Schwartzkopf Inc, would now like to obtain exclusive rights in the trade mark DESERT CONFLICT. The U.S. company has a policy that all trade mark rights of the company or its subsidiaries be held in the name of Schwartzkopf Inc.

You have been provided with some information concerning sales of the DESERT CONFLICT game.

The launch in 1985 was very low key. There was no advertising and the sales for that year were very disappointing - in the region of £16,000. Manufacturing of the game was discontinued in January, 1986. Some sales from stock did take place but no sales figures for January to September, 1986 are available.

A revised form of the game was introduced in time for the peak sale time of Christmas 1986 and was an immediate success. The game was heavily advertised on Saturday morning children's television and sales to date since the relaunch have amounted to £2.3 million. You know that the Client exhibits at all major U.K. toy fairs although you have not been given confirmation on whether the DESERT CONFLICT game was featured at any of them.

During the Gulf crisis the game was the subject of much comment. For example, it appeared as a prop in a series of sketches in the Channel 4 satirical glove puppet show 'Three Fingers'. 10 games were given away by The Sun Newspaper as prizes in their 'Spot the Mobile Scud Launcher' competition.

Write a letter to Schwartzkopf Inc. advising them how they should proceed to obtain protection for DESERT CONFLICT in the United Kingdom.

Based on the information to hand, prepare a draft statutory declaration for their consideration, indicating within the draft the nature and scope of any additional information/material necessary to complete a declaration acceptable to the Trade Marks Registry in support of the application.

5. You receive the following letter from your U.S. Clients, Silverado Fragrances Inc., formerly a Pennsylvania corporation:-

'We have reached an agreement with Elliot Chemicals Inc., also a U.S. company, to buy its entire fragrance and personal care products business, including the worldwide rights to the trade marks used in that business. Elliot want to concentrate on its 'core' business in upholstery and carpet cleaning products. The whole transaction is valued at U.S.\$2.5 million, about 95% of which is accounted for by the U.S. business.

The trade marks involved are WOLFDANCE and REVENGE. Elliot has a registration of WOLFDANCE in the United Kingdom, details of which are set out on the schedule below. It allowed its registration of REVENGE to lapse three years ago, through a failure to pay the renewal fee after they had stopped importing the range of products sold under the mark because of poor sales. However, the REVENGE mark is of great interest to us as it is a very successful fragrance in Europe and we want to ensure that the United Kingdom rights are in our name.

WOLFDANCE aftershave is selling reasonably well in the United Kingdom and we plan to bring over the full range of male-grooming products presently sold in the U.S.A. only, namely facial cleansing scrub, skin freshener, shampoo, conditioner, after-sun re-moisturiser and deodorant.
