Question 11

Your client wishes to launch a new product in most countries of the EU, as well as Switzerland, Norway and two Baltic states, Lithuania and Estonia. Three months ago, you filed a UK trade mark application on his behalf for the product involved, but the application has not yet been examined. At the time of the UK filing, your client did not explain that he planned to market the product outside the UK, so your clearance searches covered only prior rights in or affecting the UK.

Outline the advice you would now give your client and the steps you would advise him to take.

The mark is in use in the UK but your client is not intending to put the mark into use for another four years in these remaining countries, your client has instructed you to file national applications in the countries in question. What warnings would you give arising from his plans to delay use of the mark abroad?
