# Criteria for TRUE/FALSE questions:

- If True or False is correct and there is a quote but it is wrong = 1 mark.
- If True or False is incorrect NO marks, irrespective of quote.
- If True or False is correct and quote is correct = 2 marks.
- Words must be quoted from the passage and not contextualised if True or False is correct but contextualisation is given = 1 mark.
- If True or False and no quote no marks.
- If Yes and No instead of True or False no marks.
- If T or F instead of True or False no marks.
- Look out for the key phrase in the quotation.
- Words contained in the quotation MUST be spelt 100% correctly. 9.
- 10. No word(s) may be omitted from a quotation without proper indication.
- If only the quotation is given without True/False NO MARKS. 11.
- If no inverted commas or punctuation at the beginning or the end, NO penalty. 12.

# Criteria for questions in which students only have to quote:

- Words contained in the quotation MUST be spelt 100% correctly.
- No word(s) may be omitted from the quotation.
- Do not penalise the student if quotation marks are not used.

#### QUOTES

- 1. "Don't show off by speeding, rather stick to the speed limit."
- 2. "Be a responsible driver." OR "Don't drive like an idiot."
- 3. "Don't go through red lights."
- 4. "Wear your seatbelt."
- 5. "Remember that drinking and driving kills."
- 6. "Never drive and talk on your cell-phone at the same time."
- 7. "Don't give in to road rage."

#### MARKING:

- > The candidate must rewrite the core idea in his own words as far as possible.
- Changes in the word order of the quote are acceptable if they are grammatically correct.
- > Mark for seven correct facts, ONE mark for each different fact.
- > Number of words correctly indicated earns ONE mark.
- > Write the number of the credited fact above the tick.
- > Indicate quotes by placing "Q" at the in the left hand margin.
- Mark only ONE fact per sentence ignore the second. If an incorrect fact occurs first, the candidate unfortunately forfeits the mark for his second possibly correct fact.
- > If given in paragraph format treat one sentence as one fact. The candidate automatically forfeits both language marks.
- > If written in telegram style the candidate automatically forfeits both language marks.
- > Count the number of words up to the maximum and draw //. Ignore the rest.

## PENALTIES:

- > If the maximum of 60 words is exceeded, no mark is allocated for length, OR if number of words isn't indicated or obviously incorrectly indicated, the candidate also forfeits the mark.
- > Indicate ALL grammar, spelling and punctuation errors:
  - 0 3 errors = 2 marks
  - 4 6 errors = 1 mark
  - 7 more errors = 0 marks
- > Recurring errors are penalised only once.
- > If quoted in all instances (7 quotations) NO language mark.
- > The marks for language and number of words combined (Bonus Marks) may not exceed mark obtained for the facts.
