Therefore, when plane took off from JNB, time in SYD was 18:10 plus 9 hrs = 27:10 = 03:10 on Tuesday.
Add flying time of 14 hrs = 17:10 when he lands and he still has to go through customs and immigration and get to the meeting so will be unable to make a meeting at 16:30. (3)
