### Choose one question.

Record and develop your ideas from direct observation and personal experience in order to meet all the assessment objectives.

### 1 Design using lettering

Design a poster for a museum exhibition to be called **Time and Motion**. Include the name of the venue, the objects you will show and the historical period featured.

# 2 Illustration and calligraphy

### Either:

(a) Design a set of the following letters ABCDEF, based on **Found or Discovered Letterforms**. Develop six different designs, one for each of the letters ABCDEF. You can include both black & white and colour designs. The letters should be the same height and share the same baseline.

Or:

(b) Design a book jacket for a collection of poems on the theme **Memories and Dreams**. You should include the front, spine and back of the book. Invent the publisher's name or use your own.

### 3 Fabric design

Design a repeat pattern based on the theme of **Patterns in Places**.

### 4 Fashion design

Design the costume for a character from a computer game called **Stone Matrix**.

### 5 Interior design

Design a mural for the reception area of a hospital or clinic, based on the theme **Textures and Surroundings**.

### 6 Environmental design

Design an entrance area for an outdoor sculpture exhibition called **Confused Spaces**. The entrance area will be on an existing flat space at the top of a small hill. Incorporate a set of steps into your design and include **three** of the following: disabled access, ticket office, information display, video projection area, raised viewing area, shop or café.
