You are advised to spend about 30 minutes on this part of the paper and to write between 200 and 300 words. Total marks for this part: 20.

There have been some unusual noises every night of the last five nights near where you live. They happened at the same time and in the same way each night. Your family and neighbours are very upset. Last night you saw what happened and you now decide to report to the police.

Write your report. You **must** include the following information:

- at what time and where this occurred
- what exactly happened
- · who was involved
- why your family and the neighbours are so upset
- what you want the police to do.

You must cover all five points in detail. You should also add further details if you wish and make your report clear and helpful.
