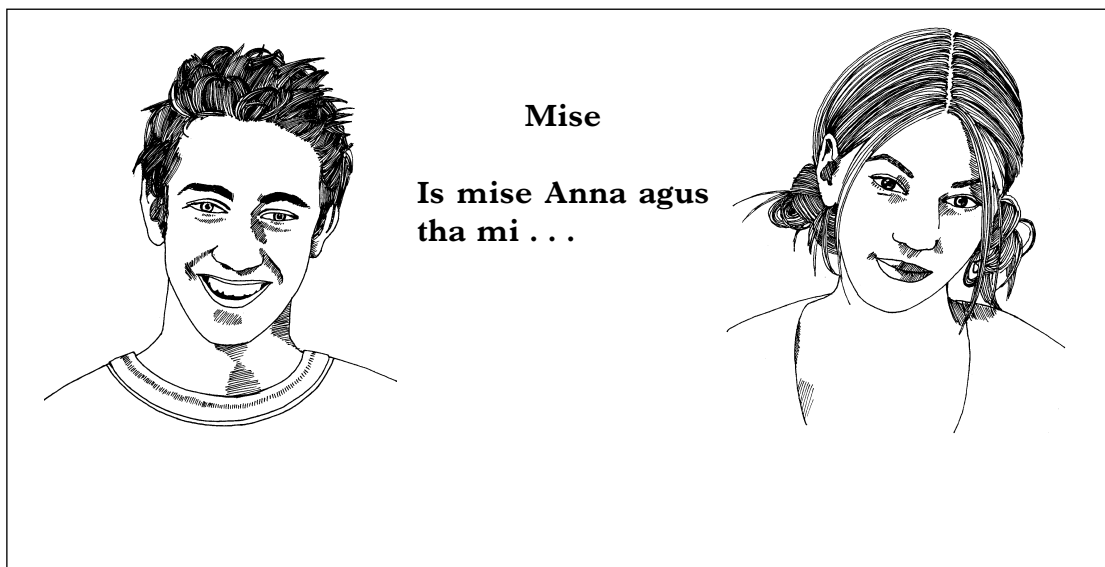
SECTION A

EITHER

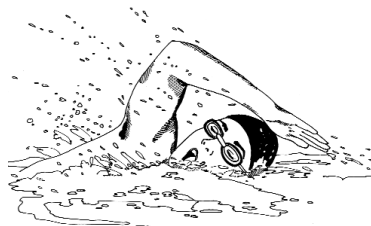
1. Your school has advised you to write a CV or Personal Statement about yourself for when you apply for a job or further education. They have suggested you include information that an employer/college would want to know about you.
