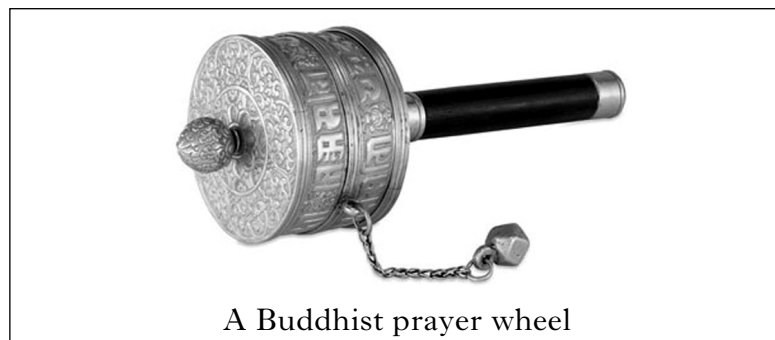

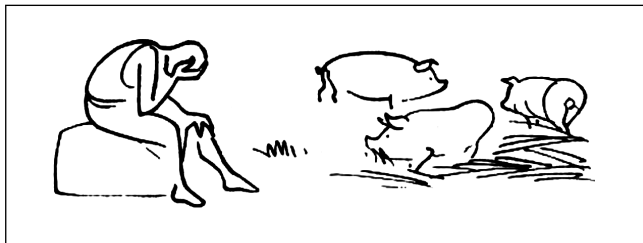

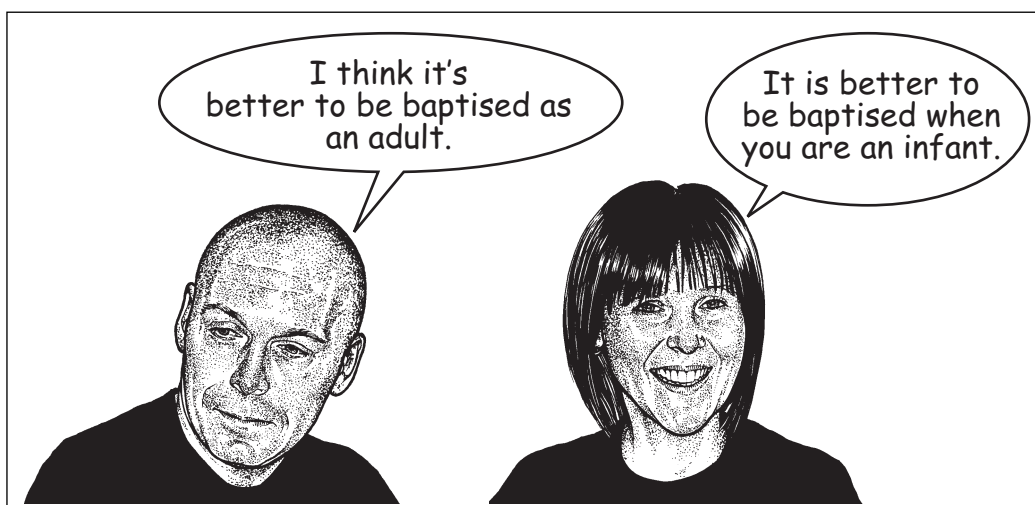

HINDUISM

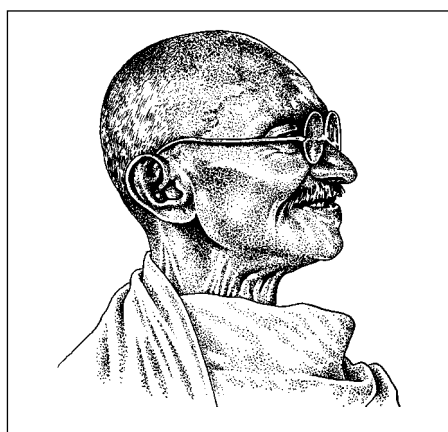

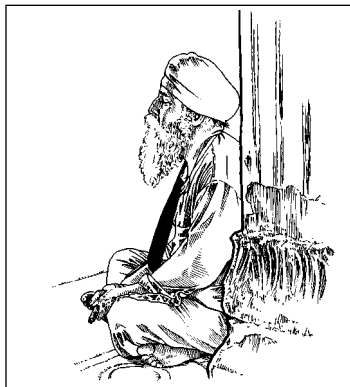

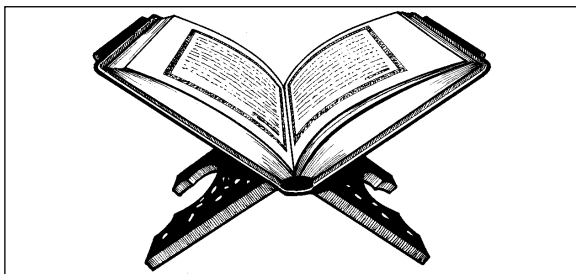

Gender roles are set at a very early age. Men and women are often taught to expect different things in life. This can lead to problems in our society.

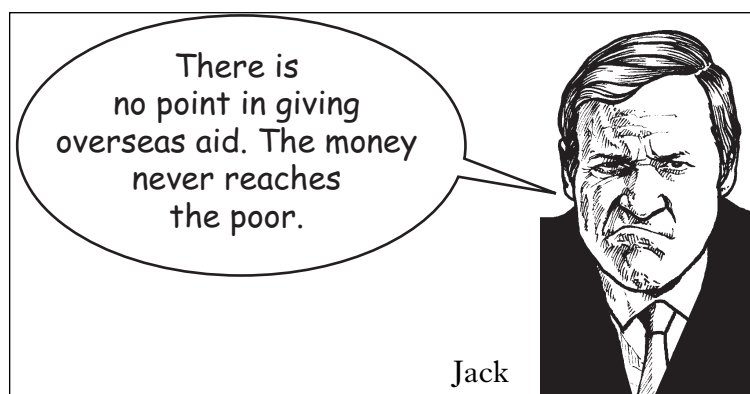

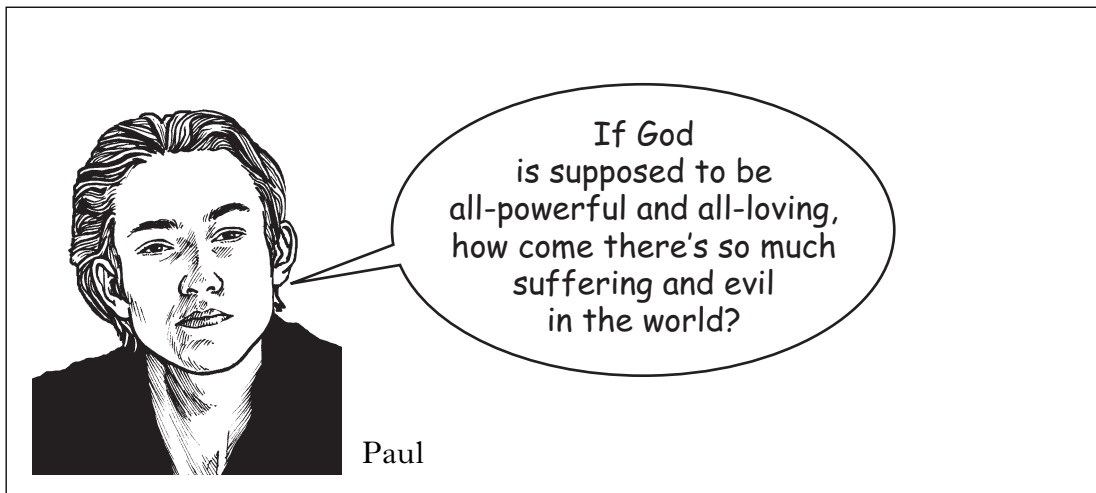
