The passage will be read a second time and you may take further notes and answer the rest of the questions. After this second reading you will be given a further three minutes for a final revision of answers.

- a. 3 minutes Teacher reads out the questions
- b. 3 minutes First reading aloud of passage while students take notes
- c. 3 minutes Students may answer questions
- d. 3 minutes Second reading of passage and possibility of answering questions
- e. 3 minutes Final revision

A female hamster can have a litter of 6 - 12 young. Young hamsters have no fur and they are born with their eyes and ears closed.




