



Dogs are meat-eating mammals. They can smell, see and hear much better than we can. In the wild, they use these senses to help them hunt for food. As pets however, they get their food from their owners.

Pet dogs eat any kind of meat, but do you know they also eat cereals, fruit and vegetables Puppies need three to four meals a day but older dogs can be fed twice a day. It is good to bathe your dog once a week. They should not bathe too often because that will make their skin and coat too dry.

Dogs like to have other dogs or humans around them. They bark and make other sounds to talk to one another. They can be trained to do things, like fetch a ball or sit when you tell them to. Some can be trained to rescue people or guide the blind. They need exercise and a lot of attention.

Dogs can also fall sick and when that happens, they need to see the veterinarian. If you take good care of your dog, they can live up to twenty years!
