



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

### PERFECTLY PRESERVED BABY MAMMOTH FOUND



Female baby wootly manimoth

In Northern Russia, the body of a female baby woolly mammoth has been discovered. Scientists think it is about 10,000 years old.

It is so well-preserved that it looks as if it died only a few days ago. The animal weighs 50 kilogrammes and is 1.3 metres tall.

The baby mammoth or calf was discovered by Yuri Khudi, a reindeer herder. He alerted the scientists at the nearby town of Salekhard. The baby mammoth has been nicknamed Lyuba after Mr Khudi's wife.

Northern Russia is very cold so the surface of the ground is normally frozen solid throughout the year. This is known as permafrost. It was this permafrost that has preserved Lyuba for the last 10,000 years.

Scientists do not yet know what killed Lyuba but they hope to find cut. What happened to all the mammoths is still a mystery.

Lyuba is especially interesting as it died about the time at which scientists believe woolly mammoths became extinct.

There are three reasons people believed could have killed the mammoths. Some think they all died from a new type of disease. Others believe there was a sudden change in the Earth's climate. This meant that their food source - grass and other plants disappeared. Gradually, they starved to death.

The most popular reason is that they were killed by humans for their meat. Eventually, humans overhunted them and the woolly mammoths died out.

Lyuba will now be sent to Japan so the Japanese scientists can examine all the baby mammoth's internal organs. Then it will go back to St Petersburg in Russia to be studied. Eventually Lyuba will be put on display in Salekhard, the place it was found.
