Albert Schweitzer was born in 1875 in Germany. At the age of five, he had already learnt to play the piano. While he was at university, he made up his mind to spend the next ten years of his life studying music because he was very fond of all kinds of musical activities. After that, Albert devoted the rest of his life to helping others.

When he was twenty-nine, Albert read a newspaper article about the sufferings of people in equatorial West Africa. Albert could not bear to see anyone suffer, so he decided to become a doctor and work in those regions. In 1905, he went to the University of Strasbourg to study medicine.

Five years after he had qualified as a doctor, he raised funds and collected 10 medical supplies in order to set up a hospital. In 1913, together with his wife, who was a trained nurse, Albert set off as a missionary doctor for Africa. Together they built a hospital at Lambarene in Africa where they nursed the sick.

During his first year of work, Albert cared for uncountable patients. In spite of the lack of trained assistants and proper medical equipment, Albert provided 15 care for thousands of natives, which included 300 lepers.

Albert spent the rest of his life in this hospital caring for the sick and needy.

As a result of this, he was known and regarded as the most respectable doctor in Lambarene.
