Flash floods created havoc across Singapore yesterday afternoon, felling trees, snarling traffic and affecting business. The worst hit areas, according to police, were at Rochor Road, Victoria Street and Upper Picketing Street.

In the Rochor area, the sudden rise in water caught businesses in Owen and Hindoo Roads off guard. Mr Tan, a shopkeeper, found all of his low-lying merchandise ruined by the water. Hairdresser, Miss Yap, reported that some of her equipment and chemicals were damaged. She also had to work barefoot as her whole shop was flooded.

"We've had floods before but this is the worst," Miss Yap said.

The PUB is advising residents and shopkeepers in flood-prone areas to protect their belongings. Motorists are also advised to be cautious when travelling along low-lying roads prone to flash floods.
