

When he was in school, Doyle was quite rebellious and did not relish the thought of attending school. However, he enjoyed reading adventure stories as much as he liked telling them. Consequently, he was popular as a storyteller among his peers. He studied medicine when he was in the university. After his graduation, he worked as a doctor in various places. 10 Then two years after his marriage, his first Sherlock Holmes story was published. Sherlock Holmes was modelled on Doyle's professor in the university who was very good at judging a person's occupation and character by his appearance. The other main character in the Sherlock Holmes story, Dr Watson, had a similar personality as Doyle himself.

Several years later, Doyle gave up practising medicine so that he could concentrate on his writing. Besides writing detective stories, Doyle also wrote historic novels.
