Contrary to what you might think, the inspiration for the name piggy bank did not come from the pig! The piggy bank was first made in Western Europe between 16th and 17th centuries. They replaced the clay jars used to keep small change in the house and were made of an orange clay called 'pygg'.

Since the name of the clay sounded so much like the pig, the potters that made the banks decided to model their coin bank after the pig, the animal that shared the same-sounding name as the material it was made from. Even after potters replaced "pygg" with "clay", the name "pig", stuck. It was an apt name for the saving habit. We store excess money like we feed excess food to pigs until they are fat enough to be slaughtered.

In German-speaking countries, it was a tradition for artisans to give their apprentices a piggy bank to reward them for years of learning their respective trades.

Even today, it is considered good luck in many countries to give piggy banks or 'Lucky Pigs' during occasions like New Year's Day as people believe that pigs are symbolise good fortune.

Of course in countries where pigs are taboo, they still have coin banks, but just not in the shape of a living thing.
