



To see the remote Western Himalayas in India, I signed up for a 14-day package with a reliable trekking company. With nine other keen trekkers, we began our journey from Prini, 10km north of Manali.

Trekking was tiring but fun. We would pitch our tents before nightfall. Dinner usually came with a meat dish and two vegetable dishes. It was served at 7.30 pm. After that, we would have a few rounds of *Uno* before retiring at 10 pm. Then, in the morning, there would be a wake-up call at 6.30 am, by way of the team leader clanging his teapot outside our tents to indicate that breakfast was ready. After having a hearty breakfast, we would be on our way.

We could not wait to get back to the comfort of modern Singapore! However, it was a memorable experience and we would certainly make plans to visit the Himalayas again.
